PERU TRIES STAMP TAX

LIMA, Peru, Oct. 17—(Associated Press Mail)—Funds for national defense will be secured by a patriotic stamp tax, if a bill approved by the Peruvian Senate becomes a law. This act creates a 10 percent ad valorem tax on liquors, perfumes and candies and a one or two percent tax, according to price, on automobiles and carriages.

In addition it creates a tax, to be paid once only, on all automobiles actually in use.
