There is pillkia at Lahainaluna. Recently the boys have been required to use the English language only and any infraction of that rule has been punished by the imposition of extra hours of work. Ten boys left on that account. In an effort to get the boys to return a meeting was had of the scholars, teachers, prominent citizens of Lahaina and former students but the effort to show the boys the folly of their course was unavailing and they refused to return.

The road board has gone to work in earnest in Kahului. The newly bridged stream is being walled with rocks to prevent further washouts and a new bridge is being built near the Chinese coffee house. This will also be walled with rocks.

It is rumored the Lahaina Ice Works will soon be enlarged.

**SKIP JACK JILL**

Their should be eight players in each set, four Jills and four Jacks in two facing rows, two couples in each row. There are three group-dance movements, A B and C.

Movement A.—Each group joins hands in small circle, skipping sixteen steps to the left, returning on last step to original position in double row. Head Jack and Jill join hands take four sliding steps down the aisle formed between the two rows and four slides back to place. Last Jack and Jill repeat this movement.

Movement B.—Partners face, each giving right hand to partner, then passing and giving left to next partner, and so on around circle right and left hand in alteration until original partners meet. Then the Jills who are diagonally across from one another change places clasping right hands and swinging as they pass the center. Each Jill then joins left hand with her new partner, who swings her once around. Jills return to their original places, clasping right hands as they pass centre then joining right hands with their own Jacks who swing them around once.

Movement C.—Each four joins hands, walks forward two steps and courtesies to opposite players; then two steps back to place, where all courtesies. Forward again, dropping hands when lines meet, each passing through to right of advancing dancers. Again courtesies, and repeat movement returning at the end to original positions. Lively music throughout.
