### Episcopal Clergy Gathers in Portland For Triennial Meet

(ASSOCIATED PRESS)

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 6.—Thousands of Episcopal churchmen from almost every county in every state in the United States and also many from foreign lands, joined in elaborate celebrations of the holy communion this morning in every Episcopal church and mission in Portland. The services were held simultaneously at 7:30 a. m. and marked the opening of the forty-seventh triennial gathering of the general convention of the Protestant Episcopal church. The convention will be in session here until September 23. Prominent among the problems which delegates will consider are proposed changes in the Book of Common Prayer and the adoption of the program for the next three years.

At the early morning services the House of Bishops and Deputies celebrated communion at Trinity Church, the largest and finest Episcopal church in Portland, and the delegates to the triennial meeting of the Women's Auxiliary made their communion at St. Stephen's Pro-Cathedral, the church at which the bishop of Oregon worships. Similar celebrations were held at other Episcopal churches of the city for the delegates to the conventions of the smaller organizations and societies of the diocese.

The great mass meeting of the convention assembled at the municipal auditorium at 10 o'clock. All delegates from outside of Portland were provided with tickets, so none of the visitors would fail to obtain a seat, the service was one of the most spectacular and elaborate ever staged in Portland.

#### Glorious Musical Service

The service started when the great white-robed choir of 250 singers emerged from the side rooms of the building, and as they marched down the main aisle of the auditorium they sang the inspiring hymns of the church. They were accompanied by the modern \$30,000 pipe organ which is a feature of the auditorium.

When the singers had filled the aisles of the building they parted their ranks, while each member of the house of bishops passed through and up to the platform. The bishops who were dressed in their full episcopal robes, were led by the presiding bishop, the Most Rev. Daniel Sylvester Tuttle, D. D. L. D. of St. Louis, Mo., followed by other bishops in the order of their seniority. When the bishops had taken their places the choir closed its ranks and followed them to the platform.

Morning prayer was then said by the Rev. Alexander Mann, rector of the trinity Episcopal church, Boston and president of the House of Deputies. The Bible lessons were read by Dr. Henry Anstice, of New York City secretary of the House of Deputies, and Dr. J. F. Nelson, secretary of the House of Bishops. The Rt. Rev. Edward T. Lines, bishop of the diocese of Newark, preached the convention sermon, followed by the benediction by Bishop Tuttle. Bishop Walter Taylor Sumner of Oregon was master of ceremonies.

At the conclusion of the celebration the delegates adjourned to the basement of the auditorium where luncheon was served.

#### Opening Session Held

During the early afternoon the House of Bishops and the House of Deputies met for their first sessions, when preliminary organization work was done. The first few days will be devoted principally to organization and the hearing of reports from various commissions.

Possibly the outstanding social event of the convention is set for tonight when the visiting bishops and members of their families accompanying them will be entertained at Bishopcroft, the Episcopal residence in Oregon, by Bishop and Mrs. Sumner. Those who have been selected to receive the guests are Bishop Tuttle and his sister, Mrs. Sarah R. White, both of St. Louis; Bishop and Mrs. Thomas P. Gallor, of New York City, and Bishop and Mrs. Sumner, of Oregon.

Present indications point to this convention being the largest in the history of the church. The housing committee has the names of 5,000 official delegates and visitors listed on its books or twice the number which were registered at the last triennial convention in Detroit, Mich., in 1919. Hundreds of delegates who arrived early this week have spent the time as guests of local Episcopals viewing the Columbia River Highway and other scenic points in and about the city.
