That Revolution.

The Chronicle of the 25th says:

The steamer Newbern, which arrived yesterday from Mexican ports, brings news of a revolution inaugurated by Gen. Manuel Marquez, near La Paz, Lower California, against the Diaz Government. Gen. Marquez, with a body of 150 men, occupied the town of Triunfo, and met with such sympathy from the inhabitants as to determine him to take possession of La Paz.

The news of Marquez's advance caused the officials and merchants of that town to fly precipitately, and there is no doubt that everything would have fallen into the hands of the revolutionists had it not been for the timely arrival of Gen. Carbo in the gunboat "Democrata," with 100 Federal soldiers.

This temporarily stopped the progress of Marquez. At the date of the sailing of the Newbern from Guaymas it was reported that there had been heavy fighting between the different parties, and that the revolutionary party was daily increasing in strength.

About the same time Col. Ramirez pronounced against the Government in Mazatlan, but before he could make any headway he was captured and lodged in jail.

The Consulate at San Francisco had the same information.
