

TELEGRAPHIC.

Special Dispatches to the Arizona Miner, By Western Union and U. S. Military Lines.

Washington, April 3.—The Georgia delegation received resolutions passed by the Augusta merchants exchange favoring Government aid to the Texas-Pacific R. R., and requesting Senators and Representatives in Congress from Georgia to advocate the guarantee of interest on bonds of the Company to such an extent as may be required to obtain the early completion of the road.

In the Senate to-day, Hubbard's postal telegraph bill was reported favorably by the P. C. Committee, and ordered placed on the Calendar.

In the House, Committee on Territories reported a recommendation for the admission of the Territory of New Mexico as a State.

Congressman Nesmith of Oregon made a strong argument to-day before the House Committee on Railways, in behalf of the Portland, Dalles and Salt Lake railroad bill. The committee agreed upon a favorable report. The bill provides that Government guarantee payment of interest upon bonds of the company to the amount of \$10,000 per mile in the State of Oregon.

In consideration of such aid the company agree to transport all U. S. mails and army supplies free of charge forever.

New York, April 3.—Henry G. Stebbins, financial agent of the Texas-Pacific Railway Co., goes to Europe in June. It is not known whether his visit is connected with business of the company.

Boston, April 3.—Ballotting for U. S. Senator at a dead lock.

San Francisco, April 3.—The five mile trotting race at Oakland yesterday was won by Lady Mack, in thirteen minutes. Fastest time on record.

San Francisco, April 3.—Butcher story telegraphed from Austin, Nevada, yesterday, proves to be an April fool hoax.

The Stock Board of New York did not meet to-day, it being Good Friday. Consequently, have no gold reports.

Washington, April 2.—The contract for carrying the mails from Cleveland to Arcata, heretofore awarded to Haslett and contested by Force, both bids given for the same amount, was to-day given to Force, on the ground that he is the present contractor and has the road stocked. Luttrell filed the papers for each party, but took action in favor of neither.

The Taggart-Goddard contest is still held under consideration. Goddard turns out to be a resident of Vermont, but gave Yreka as his postoffice address because he intends to remove there.

Cohose, N. Y., April 3d.—The Tivoli mills burned this p. m. Loss \$20,000; insured for \$18,000. Gregory & Hill's mill was also burned.

New York, April 3.—The Prussian bark Jupiter, bound from New York to Gibraltar, experienced terrible weather February 7th, when three days out. A squall struck the vessel and the same time a heavy sea passed over her and swept Capt. Grongriger and six of the crew from deck. Return were back one of the crew, but the others were lost.

Norwegian steamer Anna Nore, 47 days out, from New York to Rotterdam, has not been heard from since she sailed.

Philadelphia, April 2.—Amst, a saloon keeper was convicted to-day of violating the Sunday liquor law. A woman testified to having obtained liquor from him ostensibly for her sick mother, but really, to obtain grounds for filing against him, to punish him for selling liquor to her husband. Sentence suspended.

City council to-day passed \$1,000,000 Centennial bill by acclamation.

Cleveland, April 3.—800 laborers at the Union depot struck for \$1.75, instead of \$1.50, former pay, per day.

Louisville, April 2.—Fire at Lancaster yesterday, burned eleven prominent buildings. Loss, \$400,000.

San Francisco, April 3.—Steamer Alaska from China and Japan, arrived this evening, reported Capt. Higgins, agent P. M. Co. here has tendered his resignation.

New York, April 4.—The P. M. Co. have perfected arrangements to run their steamers, which will leave Hong Kong, San Francisco and New York every fortnight.

San Francisco, April 4.—Rufus Hatch, vice president of the P. M. S. Co. is en route to San Francisco. Capt. Higgins has resigned and Edward Taylor has been appointed acting agent in his stead.

Goodale, Nelson & Perkins deny reports that they intend to withdraw their coast steamers. The steamer Pacific sailed at 5 p. m. to-day, with 20 passengers.

Gold in New York, 113 3/4. Greenbacks in San Francisco, 87 1/2 and 88 1/2.

Washington, April 3.—Commissioner of the General Land Office to-day reversed the decision of the Register and Receiver at Carson City, Nevada, in the claim of the C. P. R. R. Co. against the State of Nevada, to a tract of land in the vicinity of Virginia City and Gold Hill. Testimony established the fact that no mines have been discovered on said tract, but it may be in the mineral belt, and is in the immediate vicinity of the Comstock lode. Notwithstanding the undeveloped character of the land, its situation indicates the existence of mineral in that vicinity. The testimony fully established the fact that the land is not of any value whatever for agricultural purposes, and if it has any value it is in undeveloped mines.

San Francisco, April 4.—In the 20-mile trotting race at Oakland Park, Mattie Howard was beaten by Stewart.

London, April 4.—The Carlists report a revolt in Bilbao; that only half of their army has been engaged in the battles and that Sanz will shortly march with a strong division on Madrid, to cut off Serrano's communication.

The Government is still without official advice of the escape of Rochefort and his companions.

Madrid, April 3.—An official dispatch says that four hundred of Sanz's men have deserted to the Republican ranks.

Melbourne, April 3.—Rochefort and his companions refuse to tell how they got on board the vessel on which they escaped, for fear of implicating friends.

Washington, April 6.—The commissioner appointed to examine the portions of the Texas Pacific railroad already constructed, has submitted his report to the Secretary of the Interior, in which he says he has examined the already constructed road and finds it well built and equipped, and recommends acceptance.

Patents will shortly be issued to the trustees of the San Diego public land, comprising 47,323 acres, less the amount retained as a military reservation at Ballast Point.
