Population of London.

Of the total population of London returned by the registrar in 1871 (3,254,260), 3,029,260 were born in England and Wales, 41,029 in Scotland, 91,171 in Ireland, 23,324 in the colonies and India, 3,170 in the islands of the British seas, and 1,205 in ships at sea. The remainder, 66,101 were foreigners, nearly half Germans, and the rest comprising almost all nationalities. The population was estimated by the registrar in the middle of 1874 at 3,400,000. The postal district covers an area of 250 square miles. The metropolitan police district comprises many towns, villages, and parishes, formerly independent, and still often spoken of as such, and extends over the whole of Middlesex (exclusive of London city, which had its own police), and the surrounding parishes in the counties of Surrey, Kent, Essex, and Hertford, of which any part is within twelve miles of Charing Cross, and not over fifteen miles, embracing an area of 687 square miles, and a population in 1871 of 2,908,860, or, including the city police district, 2,883,092, being one-eighth of the whole population of the United Kingdom, and 500,000 more than that of all Scotland. This does not include transient residents, whose number is immense at all times, and especially between May and August, when the patricians, politicians, and votaries of fashion are in town, together with many interested in parliamentary business.—(Appleton's American Cyclopaedia, revised edition, article "London.")

## School Tax Election.

WHEREAS, it appearing to the Board of Trustees of School District No. 1, in the county of Yavapai, Arizona Territory, that the territorial and county money to which the said district is entitled, is insufficient to pay for keeping a school open in said district for a period of more than three months in each year, and erect suitable buildings for keeping the same, and that the additional sum of \$6000 is necessary therefor.

And Whereas, in the judgment of said board it is deemed advisable that a direct tax be levied upon the taxable property of said district to keep said school open for a longer period than the ordinary funds will allow, and to build suitable buildings therefor, and that the question of levying a tax be submitted to the voters of the district.

Therefore, Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in School District No. 1, in Yavapai county, Arizona Territory, on Saturday, the 6th day of April, 1876, at the office of the Probate Judge of said county, between the hours of 9 a. m. and sundown on said day, for the purpose of ascertaining the majority of the taxable property within said district for the keeping of a school open in such district and building suitable buildings for the same, as above set forth. The amount of money proposed to be raised therefor being \$6,000. Ballots shall read "Tax Yes" or "Tax No," and also state the name of one person for assessor and one collector.

## NO. 9.

### An Ordinance Relating to Village Taxes and Licenses.

It is ordained by the Mayor and Council of the Village of Prescott, Arizona:

Section 1. A tax shall be levied upon all taxable property in the Village of Prescott, and that the rate of taxation shall be, for the year 1876, fixed at one-half (1/2) of one per cent, said rate being made upon the basis of the amount of value of assessed property in said Village, as taken from the county assessment roll for the year 1875, and said tax shall be due and payable on or before the 10th day of June, 1876, and be declared delinquent on the 10th day of July, 1876.

Section 2. All business men doing business within the corporate limits of the Village of Prescott, and paying a county license tax quarterly therefor, who have not been mentioned and specified in Ordinance No. 8, relating to licenses, shall be required to pay quarterly for the use and benefit of the said Village of Prescott, according to the business done by them, to be determined by the Assessor, who is ex-officio Assessor and Collector, or his deputy, in the following ratio, viz:

First Class, to pay quarterly, the sum of ..... \$30.00  
Second Class ..... 25.00  
Third Class ..... 20.00  
Fourth Class ..... 15.00

And one dollar added to the amount of each license as fee for collection by said Assessor or his deputy.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in force from and after the 10th day of June, 1876, and until the 10th day of June, 1877.
