The Mass Convention, the proceedings of which are published elsewhere, to nominate candidates for Council and House of Representatives, met as per call, published in this paper on Friday, at the Court House on Wednesday at 2 p.m. There is some dissatisfaction with the shortness of time the notice was given, but when the fact is taken into consideration that the census imbroglio at Tucson delayed the apportionment and issuing of the Governor's Proclamation to so late a day that it gave no time for an extended notice, without rendering it almost impossible to print and circulate tickets into the remote precincts, some of which are 200 miles distant, we think the shortness of the notice will be excused. No one, we think, will question the soundness or fitness of the ticket nominated, and yet there are names left off that we and others having the interest of Yavapai County most at heart would be glad to vote for. The objection that Prescott is too largely represented is met by the fact that a majority of those nominated have almost their entire property interests in the country. Rush, Kendall, Moeller and Hathaway, being the only ones whose chief interests are in Prescott. Stevens, Miller, Marion, Peck, Hutchinson, Foster and Richards, all have their interests outside of the town and all live in the country, except Hutchinson and Foster and they are there half their time, so that the town has but really four of the country's eight. Of those in the country Richards and Foster are engaged in milling; Stevens, Marion, Hutchinson and Miller in farming and stock raising and Peck in farming and mining; W. S. Head lives at Verde where he is Post Trader. Nearly every material interest in the County is represented on the ticket.

For the information of the public, it may be stated that stages now leave Prescott on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, at 1 p. m. Fare—\$50 currency, to the terminus Southern Pacific Railroad;—time, 4 days. The completion of the Railroad affords a direct, all rail route, to San Francisco,—through time, 34 hours. Through Tickets are issued to all principal points. Fare from the terminus to San Francisco, Sacramento, and San Jose, first-class unlimited, \$88 coin; first-class limited, \$30 coin; Emigrant limited, \$20 coin. The regular first-class ticket entitles the holder to lay over at any point en route, upon procuring proper stop-over check from the conductor. The next lower rate (\$30) is also first-class, but is limited to a continuous passage by first train and its connections, and becomes void if not presented upon the day for which it is sold. Emigrant tickets are also limited to continuous trip, and by freight train from Los Angeles, holder of this ticket takes passage, from terminus to Los Angeles, by same train as those holding first-class tickets. Difference in time between first-class and Emigrant is a fraction more than one day.

The steamer rates are not changed. Fare from terminus to San Francisco, including first-class passage on steamer, is \$22.30 coin.
