



REPUBLICAN PRIMARY.

With the Exception of One Ward Everything Went Smoothly.

The "Up-Towners" Makes an Unsuccessful Bolt in the Third Ward—Caucus Tickets Elected.

Yesterday's Republican primary election was one of the most quiet and orderly that has taken place in Sacramento in a long time.

Straight tickets were voted for everywhere, and there was no opposition except in the Third Ward.

In consequence the voting was unusually light.

THIRD WARD. In the first precinct of this ward was the only "scrap" of the day. It appeared that the "down-towners" had some clever work in the caucus of Friday night, even though they were in the minority, and as a result, got the names they wanted on the ticket. W. P. Harlow, leader of the "up-towners," and William Lamphrey, who captains the "down-towners" delegation in this precinct, reached an agreement Friday night, to the effect that neither side would fight, no matter what names the ticket bore. This was before the names had been agreed upon, and Harlow was morally certain that his faction had the best of everything.

The ticket did not turn out right and when the poll was closed yesterday, Harlow was on hand with his hands full of scratched tickets, and he declared himself a "bolter." SKILLFUL SAFE CRACKERS.

Sacramento, as Usual, Is Not Neglected by the Crooks.

The Men Who Operated so Successfully in San Francisco and Other Places Are Here.

For the past four or five months a brace of daring and skillful safe-crackers have been operating in the State, particularly in San Francisco. Their work has been described as being the "cleanest" ever seen, and in each instance it has been done in the same manner. That the work has been done by the same men, the police officials who have been on their track never doubted.

Disguising people, in visiting California, seldom neglect to stop over a day or so in the capital city, and Sacramento has not been forgotten by these clever safe-robbers.

When the bookkeeper of A. S. Hopkins and Bros' place of business on J street opened up his office yesterday morning, he made the startling discovery that the safe had been tampered with, both inside and out. A small hole had been drilled through the heavy iron door, close to the self as the door was opened, and the lock was blown out.

The prowlers did not make the "haul" they expected, however. It was stated yesterday that the safe was in money was in the safe at the time.

Sheriff Cunningham, the veteran Sheriff of Stockton, was in town yesterday, and, in company with Constable Brissell of this city, examined Hopkins' safe.

"The same man that did this job broke open a safe in Stockton recently," he said after he had finished his examination. "The work is identical on the safe, and it is in the same manner as they did in our town. I am pretty sure I know who these men are. There are two of them, and you would be surprised at the result."

STYLE THEY PUT ON. When traveling the streets in the daytime. These men are the same fellows who blew open the safe in the Wigwam Theater, in San Francisco, a couple of months ago, and they are also the same chaps who emptied a safe in San Jose.

Workers are, without doubt, the cleverest they ever had to deal with—that is, in their particular line of business. What they do not know about safe-opening is not worth knowing. They can open the best safe ever made. They understand thoroughly the construction of every alleged "patent burglar-proof" safe.

For instance, there is one particular safe in which the lock is always immediately back of the combination spindle. These fellows simply knock off the knob, drill through the spindle, and there they are right into the lock. With safes like the one in Hopkins' place, however, the lock is situated in front of the door, and their friends operate as they did in this case—drill about two inches to the left of the spindle and blow out the lock.
