

HE SHOULD HAVE LOOKED. No Damages for a Man Who Gets Off at the Wrong Station.

How William Nagle Fell Into a Cannon--"Look Before You Leap"--A Nonsuit.

The Supreme Court has affirmed the judgment of the Superior Court of San Diego County in the case of William C. Nagle against the California Southern Railroad Company--a suit for damages for personal injuries alleged to have been sustained by Nagle.

Nagle boarded one of the defendant's trains at San Diego and bought a ticket for La Jolla, a small station on that road. He had been to La Jolla before, and knew where it was, and also knew that there was a platform there to get out upon.

When the case came up in the Superior Court, the railroad people moved for a nonsuit, and it was granted. Nagle appealed the case to the Supreme Court, but this tribunal now decides against him, too.
