PROUTY'S TALE OF WOE.

He Says Supervisor Bates and the Devins Defrauded Him.

He Claims to Have Lost \$3,000 Through Misplaced Confidence—Supervisor Bates' Explanation.

A rather sensational suit has been commenced in the Superior Court, in which S. Prouty, manager of the Commercial Hotel at Oak Park, plaintiff, and Supervisor George O. Bates and Mrs. William H. Devin are the defendants.

Mrs. Devin is the daughter of Supervisor Bates, and it is alleged, owns in partnership with Prouty the hotel property mentioned.

In his complaint Prouty says that through misplaced confidence in Mrs. Devin he is out \$3,000—that he was defrauded of that sum.

He sets forth that Mrs. Devin, in order to purchase half interest in the hotel property, borrowed \$3,000 from the D. O. Mills Bank, and gave her promissory note for the payment of the money.

Prouty indorsed the note for her. Several months after, says Prouty, Mrs. Devin represented to him that a demand had been made upon her for the payment of the note, and it was necessary for her to meet the same at once, but that she had no means to do so, and requested him to advance her the money.

Prouty gave her the money, and she gave him a mortgage on her property, and a receipt for the money.
