ESTHETIC BURGLARS.

A Large Quantity of Perfumery and Hand-Mirrors Recovered.

They Were Stolen from a Drug Store and Submerged in a Slough—The Thieves.

On the night of the 14th of February last the drug store of Kirk, Geary & Co. was entered by burglars. Evidently the fellows had never heard the warning, "Who enters here leaves behind," for they plundered the show-cases of the choicest brands of soap in the establishment. If they did leave any behind them it was because their pockets would hold no more. Indeed, the fellows showed rare discrimination in their selection of plunder.

They were evidently of Jewish proclivities, for they confined their pilfering to such articles as costly cosmetics, perfumery, highly-scented soaps, combs, brushes, hand-glasses and other toilet novelties that would have graced the boulevard of a society belle.

NOTHING ELSE WANTED. The safe, which is in the rear of the store, was not molested, neither was the money-drawer, in which there were a few dollars.

The police took an invoice of the lost property and looked high and low for the burglars as well as the property. But they could get no clue to either and finally gave up the search.

YESTERDAY, however, Mr. Butler came to the conclusion that the articles had been stolen, and after first reporting the matter to the Record-Union office, he visited the police station.

SEVEN FOR CONVICTION. Another Jury Disagreement in the Daniel Gardner Case.

The jury in the Gardner case, after being out all night, were called into Judge Van Fleet's courtroom yesterday forenoon and informed that the articles had no possibility of their agreeing, and they were accordingly discharged.

While nobody imagined that the deputies had or allow the prisoner to address any passing juror, still the court considered it such an innovation upon the usual rule of procedure as to deserve a severe reprimand of choice.

Quite a heated controversy arose between the prosecuting officers and the counsel for the defense over the matter.

POISON SUSPENSION BRIDGE. It is said to be in Danger of Collapsing Under a Load.

When the County Supervisors purchased the suspension bridge over the American river at Folsom, a few years ago, and made it free to all, some repairs were made to it. Still, from time to time of late there have been rumors that the structure was unsafe.

Now comes the Folsom Telegraph with a warning to the Supervisors that the bridge is in danger of going down under a heavy load, owing to the weakness of the towers. That paper states that Round Oversey, Boyd of that district has serious fears of the safety of the bridge.
