THE COLUMN MOVES FORWARD AT LAST.

The Board of Supervisors has at last taken action, and that without a dissenting vote, in the matter of effective regulation of the liquor traffic.

The board realized on Wednesday that Sacramento County in all things relating to the saloon interest is away behind all the rest of the world, save only in the number of bars, and that in this respect it eclipses any place on the face of the globe.

With the rate \$50 a month in Los Angeles, \$75 in San Diego, \$50 in several other places, \$100 in Sutter County, and a nearly as high rate in Tehama, the Supervisors put the question to themselves that the Record-Union has so often asked, "What reason is there for the fact that the liquor license rate in Sacramento is lower than that of any other place in the United States, and that we have no regulation?"

The Trustees, however, have been deaf to these appeals, except in one instance. Through the energy and decision of Trustee McLaughlin, the board put upon the statute-book a midnight-closing ordinance for all bars.

So the Itata has been turned over to the United States Government with all the arms she took from near San Diego. This action confirms the wisdom of the Government in proceeding as it did, and justifies the belief that before long the difficulty in Chile will be settled by the intervention of the peaceful offices of our own and other governments.

"It is not the work but the worry which kills," says Miss Brackett, in an essay in Harper's Magazine. That is an oft repeated truth, but still we worry and make our work thereby twice as laborious. Rest is not nearly so essential as we have been taught to believe.
