WHITNEY, FULLER & CO. ORDINANCE NO. 29.

An Ordinance Regulating Saloons, Dance-Houses, Theaters and Places Where Intoxicating Liquors are Dispensed by Retail and Providing for Licenses Therefor.

THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE County of Sacramento, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to hereafter open, establish or conduct, or cause to be opened, established or conducted, any barroom, saloon, dance hall, theater, variety show, dancehouse or other place where wine, spirituous or malt liquors are sold, kept, brewed, bottled, bottled, or bottled, within the limits of the County of Sacramento, without first obtaining permission from the Board of Supervisors. The application for such permission shall be made by petition in writing to the Board of Supervisors, which petition must contain the names and signatures of a majority of the resident taxpayers of the district in which the saloon or place is to be established, and at the time of such application the applicant shall file with the Board of Supervisors a good and sufficient bond, to be approved by the Chairman of the Board, with two sureties in the sum of \$1,000, conditioned that the applicant shall maintain the place in a quiet, orderly and decent manner.

Section 2. After due consideration of the petition and the views of the Board of Supervisors, the Board may, in its discretion, grant or refuse to grant the same.
