Poisoned at a Church Festival. RUTLAND (Vt.), June 30.—At the Christian Church of Brighton, N. Y., Saturday night last, forty-three people were poisoned by eating ice-cream.

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CAHENSLEY'S MEMORIAL.

Full Text of His Second Appeal Put Into Circulation.

GREAT IMPORTANCE ATTACHED TO THE DOCUMENT.

EVEN BALMACEIDA'S DEFENDERS GROW INDIGNANT.

Great Suffering Among the Poorer Classes in the Province of Madras.

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The application of the Order of Railway Conductors for admission to the Holy See, discussing the proceedings, however, the conductors withdrew their application, Grand Chief Conductor Clark giving his reason substantially as follows: "The application was withdrawn because we do not wish to belong to an organization which makes its own laws and rules as it goes along to suit the emergency. The action of the council yesterday in expelling me from the Brotherhood of Railway Telegraphers settled the matter. Each organization in the federation is entitled to three votes on all questions, but because Mr. Salmaceida was in the chair yesterday the three votes were only allowed two votes. Whenever a representative of a labor organization allows personal feeling to influence his vote, so soon does he fall in his duty as a fellow man, and I believe personal feeling controlled the action of the council ever since the Chicago meeting."

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
