THE ITATA AFFAIR. The more the Itata incident is considered in the light of recent developments, the more it impresses the impartial mind that our Government cannot justly hold the ship.

She was not, therefore, a man-of-war, nor a pirate, nor did she violate the neutrality laws because she loaded with nothing contraband of war, nor did she act secretly or conceal her destination, and the refusal of papers to her was simply on suspicion that she was in some way serving the insurgents.

Senor Montt cites many authorities to show that a neutral may sell ordinary goods to either one of the belligerents or to both, in a conflict, and he produces cases in which the right of a neutral to even sell munitions of war is maintained.

Now, had we the right to make her a prisoner? By so doing were we not waging battle for Balmaceda? Our duty as a neutral is to keep hands off, and to see that aid is not rendered by our Government and people to the foe of the country with which we are at peace.

The Century fears that the question of the boundary line between the United States and British possessions on the north is to become one of very serious trouble. Certainly it would be best to settle the dispute early.
