SALEM (Or.), July 16.—Governor Penoyer this evening refused to issue a warrant for the arrest of Adam Cushing, upon the requisition of Governor Ferry of Washington.

Cushing was brought here last April from Nebraska on a requisition of Governor Penoyer to the Governor of Nebraska. The crime was receiving stolen property, and after a trial at Portland, he was acquitted.

Ferry's requisition is for the same crime committed in Washington, and Governor Penoyer refused the requisition on the ground that Cushing did not flee, but was brought here to answer for the crime, and in this case the constitutional provision had no application.

The Governor says it would be an imposition to take advantage of Cushing's forced presence in this State to subject him to arrest for an alleged crime committed elsewhere.
