THE OPPORTUNITY AT LAST.

Walking being natural, and all men in normal condition being able to walk, those who refuse to exercise the capacity and develop it, and who are content to sit when they should walk much to maintain healthful conditions, are deemed unworthy of sympathy if by reason of their neglect they suffer. 
