COLUSA VS. GLENN COUNTY.

Important Hearing to Begin Before the Executive To-Day.

It May End in a Trial That Would Last for Several Months—Is the Glenn Act Valid?

An important hearing will be commenced before Governor Markham this forenoon, the result of which will be of deep interest to the people of Colusa and Glenn Counties.

The Attorney-General inquired diligently into the subject and rendered an opinion to the effect that the Act was constitutional, and that the proofs of fraud presented to him were not sufficient, in his opinion, to invalidate the election.

"Well," he replied, "both sides will be represented by counsel. The Colusa people have retained the firms of Stanley, Stoney, Hayes and Johnson, James B. Johnson to present their arguments and proofs, and the Glenn County people will be represented by A. H. Cotton and J. C. Campbell, and the Governor is to decide the issue upon the facts presented to him."

"No, except to defend my own action in the premises," "By the way," continued General Hart, "this matter is in one sense of considerable importance to Sacramento, as well as to Colusa and Glenn Counties."


