The all-important congress of friends of irrigation and reclamation of the arid lands of the West assembled in Salt Lake City Tuesday.

The attendance is very large, 450 being present at the opening, and far in excess of expectation.

At 12:30 o'clock Colonel Donnellan called the convention to order.

The congress is called for the purpose of hastening the reclamation of the arid lands, so far as possible, and for the purpose of petitioning Congress to cede to the States and Territories the arid lands within their borders.
