THE HYDRAULIC MINING PROPOSITION. By invitation of hydraulic miners of Iowa Hill the Supervisors of this county are this week to visit that section of Placer County and observe whether or not mining as there prosecuted by the hydraulic process, is within the category of the kinds of mining that contribute materially to the filling of the navigable streams, and the destruction of, or great injury to bottom lands along such rivers and their tributaries.

The Milwaukee Sentinel says in apologizing for Minister Egan: The United States could not recognize any other government in Chile until that of Balmaceda was overthrown, and a de facto government established in its stead.

No one ever asked that the United States recognize the insurgents as constituting a government prior to the overthrow of Balmaceda. What was asked, and what should have been done, was recognition of the belligerent character of the insurgents, thus applying to them, and exacting from them and their enemy observance of the rules of war and the courtesies and common amenities of humanity.

Of course Mr. Egan's duty was to continue relations with the established government. No one ever complained of him for doing so. What he was berated for was his failure to report from July to September the facts upon which recognition of belligerency might have been grounded.

What objection can be reasonably made to this proposition? When the defendant proposes to the plaintiff that he decide the case at issue, the plaintiff who declines is a fool. The people of the valley are not the enemies of the people of the mines. They have not gone into the courts to invoke the protection of the law in a spirit of malignity or anger.

The valley is right in the position it has taken, and the courts have wisely interpreted the law in the matter of hydraulic mining. If there are now or are hereafter discovered unobjectionable systems of hydraulic mining the valley wishes them to be employed; it is impossible to forecast what science and skill may devise and accomplish in this matter. We believe that there is ground that can be worked by hydraulic process without injury to the rivers or valley lands.

When England calls upon Turkey and Russia to justify the Dardanelles concession, we may expect bitterness to be manifest, and possibly something worse.
