

THE NEW BALLOT.

Information for the Benefit of the Voting Public.

Modified Australian Ballot System—It Must Govern the Coming School and Charter Election.

On the first Monday in December the citizens of Sacramento will be called upon to elect several School Directors and also to vote on the question of electing fifteen freeholders to frame a new charter.

That election must be held under the general election law, as passed at the last session of the Legislature. This embraces what is known as the "reform" or modified Australian ballot system. It is so wide a departure from all the laws that have governed elections in this State in the past that citizens should familiarize themselves with its features.

It is essential that the law should be thoroughly understood. An impression has been sought to be made by enemies of the law that it is intricate, involved, and not easy of comprehension, and that it will therefore operate to confuse voters and deprive some of them of their rights.

It is essential to the observance of the law that every detail required of city officials in the matter of preparation should be attended to, and so early that all the limits of the law presented regarding notices and other matters may be followed to the letter.

There can be now no excuse given for any failure to follow the law in its spirit and explicit direction as to the giving of notices, the printing of instructions, the preparation of sample ballots, the registration of nominations, the form of the ballot, etc.

In one instance in this State the spirit of the law was defeated by separating the space where the ballot-boxes should stand from the voters' preparation booths by an open area, so that electors had to pass through crowds to get to the booths.

No certificate of nomination shall contain the name of more than one candidate for each office. No person shall join in nominating more than one nominee for each office, and no person who has voted in a convention for or against a candidate for any office shall join in nominating, in any manner, any other nominee for that office, and no person shall accept a nomination to more than one office.

Certificates of nomination required to be filed with the Secretary of the legislative body of the city shall be filed not more than ten days before the day of election, when the nomination is made by convention, and not more than fifty days nor less than twenty days before the day of election, when the nomination is made by electors.

Any person whose name has been presented in any city or town, at least five days before the making of the publication of the nominations prescribed in this section, cause his name to be withdrawn from the nomination by filing with the Secretary his request therefor, in writing, signed by him and acknowledged, and no name so withdrawn shall be printed on the ballot.

At least ten days before an election to fill any public office, the City Clerk shall cause to be published, in at least two newspapers of general circulation within the county, the nominations to office certified to him by the County Clerk. He shall make not less than two such publications in each of such newspapers before election day, one of such publications being made upon the last day upon which such newspaper is issued before the day of election.

The list of nominations shall be arranged in the order and form in which they will be printed upon the ballot. Where only one newspaper is published in any city or town the publication in such newspaper shall be deemed sufficient, and where no newspaper is published in such city or town the publication shall be made through a newspaper designated by the legislative body of such city or town, and by posting copies of the ballot in three of the public places in such city or town.

It shall be the duty of the Clerk or Secretary of the legislative body of any incorporated city or town to provide separate ballots for every election for city or town officers, in which the electors, or any of the electors, of such city or town participate, and to cause to be printed in such separate ballots the name of every candidate whose name has been filed with such clerk or secretary in the manner provided for in this code.

Such paper shall be water-marked with a design to be furnished by the Secretary of State, in such manner that the said water-mark shall be plainly discernible on the outside of such ballot when folded according to law. Such design shall be kept secret from all persons not engaged in the preparation, printing or distribution of the paper or ballots, until the day of election.

MINIATURE BALLOT.

The full sized ticket must be eighteen inches long and wide enough to contain all candidates names in the order in which they must be voted for by electors. The ballot is to be printed on Record-Union notes, and not words to appear on the ballot, but are our explanations of the ticket or ballot.

Ballot is eighteen inches long and four and a half inches wide, and may be as thick as is needed to contain all necessary columns required to present names of all candidates.

The proper number of general tickets of the kind to be used in the election precinct, in sealed packages, with marks on the outside clearly designating the precinct or polling place for which they are intended, and the number of ballots included.

RECEIPTS TO BE GIVEN. The Clerk or Secretary shall prepare a receipt for each polling place, enumerating the packages and stating the time and day and date when the same were delivered by him to the Inspectors of Election. The Inspectors of Election shall sign said receipt upon receipt of the packages, which shall forthwith be returned to him by the Clerk or Secretary.

BALLOT CLERKS TO BE APPOINTED. Two Ballot Clerks for each election precinct shall be appointed, whose duty it shall be to have charge of the ballots on the day of election, to furnish them to the voters in the manner hereinafter provided.

Such Ballot Clerks shall possess the same qualifications, and shall be paid the same compensation, as Inspectors of Elections. In making appointments of such Ballot Clerks, one of them shall be taken from the political party that polled the largest number of votes at the last preceding election, and the other from the party that polled the next largest number of votes.
