THE BUILDING OF THE BOOTHS. Bids and plans have been asked for the construction of voting booths.

The matter is not one-half so difficult as it would seem to be. There is no intricacy about the voting booths, nor should they be costly.

Across the open front should be a stout guard-rail of dressed stuff with supports. In its center, or at one side, there should be a movable or sliding piece to serve as gate.

Such a booth set on the walk against a house and hooked to it—and surely no difficulty will be experienced in securing such places—can be taken apart in a few moments, trucked to a depository and stored and be ready for use at the next election, and so on for years.

Where locations can be secured beneath awnings there will be no need for a roof or cover, except over the shelf section. The cost of such booths may this year exceed the rental of rooms, but next spring's rental and next fall's rental being saved, will more than pay for the booths, and thereafter there will be no cost except to haul the cleared pieces to the places chosen and to hook them together.

Of course where a very large room with several wide doors can be secured, the shelf, partitions and guard-rail alone will be needed; but rental must be paid in such cases, and hence there is no economy in that system, and the shelf and guard-rail will be lost, as it is unlikely that they could be again used or fitted to a room differently proportioned.

The city could employ a competent workman to make the movable booths, and place them, under plans and specifications of its own drawing, much cheaper. In our opinion, than by calling for bids. The city ought to know what it wants and not ask builders to interpret the law as to what is a proper booth.

Difficulty was not experienced in Ohio in these matters, and Californians should not confess that they are less intelligent or capable than our Buckeye friends.

The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railroad Company, of which there is some considerable gossip in San Francisco, has the right to run its trains into San Francisco at any hour over the Southern Pacific tracks. It is, therefore, whenever it wishes, as fully a competing road as if it had a separate track to the metropolis, but the intelligence of San Francisco does not seem to have been able to grasp this simple fact of existing conditions.

So far as competition, therefore, with the Southern Pacific is concerned, the foreign road is better off than if it had a separate track. But a new track would give some communities of the State advantages and facilities they do not now possess; they would be benefited by rail connection; their gain would be State gain. It is therefore every way desirable that such independent line be built.

The Southern Pacific Company would not have reason to complain of such construction, because whatever influence because of a competing line to San Francisco from the cities of the Southwest would be felt by it, is already experienced.

ever, it is all true, as the Times-Democrat insists, the remedy it proposes is precisely in line with the excuse the woman makes who prostitutes her body for gain.
