

CONGRESS ORGANIZED.

Crisp Sworn in as Presiding Officer of the House.

COMMITTEES APPOINTED TO SEVENTH ON THE PRESIDENT

Large Number of Vacancies Existing in the Senate Standing and Select Committees--Consensus Bureau Bulletin Issued on the Subject of Transportation by Water on the Pacific Coast--The Chile Incident to Form One of the Principal Subjects Treated in the President's Message.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 8.--The excited feelings so apparent throughout the Speaker's contest had no part in the proceedings of the House to-day. When McMillin came in many members who had not been with him in the fight rushed up to shake hands and tell him he made a good stand against the inevitable.

When the nominations for Speaker were made this morning that of Reed was the only one greeted with applause. Jerry Simpson, acting for the Farmers' Alliance party of nine, nominated Watson of Georgia, and smiles spread over the House. When Judge Holman placed Crisp in nomination the Democrats reserved their applause for the moment when he should be declared elected and escorted into the chamber.

During the roll-call, Mills stood back and the roll was called in the usual manner. Hoar and Mills of Massachusetts, who were Mills' most ardent workers, did not vote.

The silence of the Democratic side remained unbroken while the tellers counted the votes--Crisp, 228; Watson, 85; Reed, 28. When the roll was called, Crisp was elected Speaker and a wild burst of applause filled the House. As Mills and Reed were standing on the chair all the members stood up and their places clapping their hands and cheering.

SENATE PROCEEDINGS

WASHINGTON, Dec. 8.--Immediately after the reading of the journal the oaths were administered to Jones of Arkansas (re-elected), Dubois of Idaho and Bell of Florida. The papers in the case of the credentials of Davidson, the claimant for Call's seat, were referred to the Committee on Privileges and Elections, with instructions to report on the subject to-day. A like reference was made of the papers in the case of Clegg, claiming the seat of Dulles.

The Senate then took a recess till 2 p. m. On reassembling, another recess was taken at 3 o'clock, after the appointment of Sherman and Harris as a committee to join the House committee in a visit to the President.

At 3:30 the Senate adjourned until tomorrow. THE HOUSE. WASHINGTON, Dec. 9.--When the House convened this morning there was a large crowd present.

At noon Clerk McPherson called the body to order, and on motion of Holman the election of Speaker was proceeded with. Holman placed in nomination Charles F. Crisp of Georgia.

Henderson of Illinois nominated Thos. B. Reed. [Applause on the Republican side.] Simpson of Kansas nominated Thomas U. Watson of Georgia.

Tellers were appointed and the ballot counted. The roll-called resulted: Crisp, 228; Reed, 85; Watson, 28. Mills and Springer were heartily applauded when they recorded their votes for Crisp.

HEAVY WINDS AND RAINS.

Considerable Damage Done by the Storm on Puget Sound.

A HURRICANE PASSES OVER CARSON CITY, NEVADA.

The Rainfall in the State the Heaviest Thus Far This Season--Trains Delayed in the Siskiyou by a Heavy Fall of Snow--Death of an Octogenarian at Napa--Two Members of San Bernardino's Board of Supervisors Resign Their Office.

PORTLAND, Dec. 8.--The storm Sunday night and yesterday did considerable damage on the Sound. Many trees were blown down across the railroad tracks. Several washouts were encountered on the Lake Shore, and Eastern trains are delayed.

The storm extended over the entire northwest, from British Columbia to the California line, and east to Montana. On Puget Sound steamers were delayed by the heavy wind, but no serious damage to shipping has been reported. At Fairhaven, Wash., last night, a team of horses standing on the wharf was blown into the bay and drowned, and a small sloop was broken from its moorings and drifted.

SPokane (Wash.), Dec. 8.--A heavy storm prevailed here yesterday, delaying traffic on the railway for several hours, but a warm wind has followed and the snow is melting.

REIN IN THE STATE. SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 8.--The rainstorm which commenced here to-day extends over the northern and central portions of the State, and seems to be traveling south. At many points the rain is the heaviest of the season.

REIN IN NEVADA. CARSON CITY, Dec. 8.--A hurricane of sixty miles an hour passed over this city to-day. The thick plate glass in the Bullion and Exchange Bank was forced in and cracked in several places by the wind. Lake Tahoe has prevailed the last twenty-four hours. The thermometer in the State office rose 85 to 12 in one minute, and is still rising.

DEATH OF AN OCTOGENARIAN. Born in San Francisco When There Were but Three Houses There. NAPA, Dec. 8.--Mrs. Martha Higueria prays died here to-day. She was born in San Francisco when there were but three houses there, and has seen the entire growth and development of California. Her exact age is not known, but it is thought to be about 104 years. At one time she was wealthy, owning a large tract of land in the country under a Mexican grant, but complications arose and her property was all taken from her after lengthy litigation, and she died poor.

TRANSPORTATION BY WATER. Census Bulletin Relating to the Subject on This Coast. WASHINGTON, Dec. 8.--The Census Bureau to-day issued a bulletin on the subject of transportation by water on the Pacific Coast, considered as an industry. The information furnished relates to the business of transportation by water as carried on in 1890 by all craft over five tons registered in the ports of California, Oregon and Washington.

County Officials Resign. SAN BERNARDINO, Dec. 8.--At this afternoon's session of the Board of Supervisors two members--G. W. Garcelon of Riverside and H. Glass of Highlands--resigned as members of the board, and their resignations were accepted. The other three members of the board--J. N. Victor of this city, I. W. Lord of Cucamonga and J. A. Johnson of Daguerre--worked unanimously together and decided to enlarge and rebuild the present Courthouse, at a cost of about \$50,000. Garcelon and Glass opposed this expenditure. Their reasons for resigning are not yet given to the public.

New Bank for Woodland. WOODLAND, Dec. 8.--Articles of incorporation of the Yolo County Savings Bank were filed with the County Clerk to-day. The subscribed capital is \$300,000. Following are the Directors: H. P. Meritt, J. A. Porter, Amos Gable, H. C. Lambie, E. L. Lambie, F. L. Lambie, John Wolf, from M. T. Emmet and Geo. Woodard. The place of business is Woodland. The new bank is a strong corporation, and will open in a few weeks.

Wants of Santa Ana. SANTA ANA, Dec. 8.--At a meeting of the Santa Ana Board of Trade last evening a committee was appointed to call on the Santa Fe and ask that the line from San Bernardino be extended to Santa Ana, as was first agreed upon, and another to ask the railroad companies to make Santa Ana a terminal point, with freight rates the same as San Diego and Los Angeles. It was also resolved to attend the beet-sugar meeting at Garden Grove Wednesday evening.
