PRINCIPLE AND POLITICS.

Harper's Magazine puts a whole ocean of truth into a nut shell of expression when it says: It is hardly deniable that practically nothing affects politics more radically than the moral sentiment of the people.

Which contentious wisdom we commend to citizens who exclaim that they abhor politics. What they mean, when they thus attempt to excuse themselves from duty doing is, that they abhor the methods in politics that venal and conscienceless men have injected, because, and only because the self-respecting have stood aside and permitted it.

UNION has several times made, that we get about the kind of government we deserve, neither better nor worse. When we condemn venality and shudder at mention of the "filthy pool," let us not forget we have approved the one and made the other because of our neglect of practical politics.

THE NORWEGIAN SYSTEM.

The Earl of Meath, writing in the Nineteenth Century of his visit to Norway, where he made some extended inquiries into the civilization of that country, says that he was struck forcibly by the marked diminution of drunkenness, as compared with what he saw there a few years earlier.

The industry and thrift of the people were apparent to the eye of the most indifferent observer. One sees no idlers there; everyone is at work; there are no men or women in rags, no drunkenness, no brawlers, no beggars.

In Bergen, with a population of 60,000, he found that but fourteen drinking-houses are licensed, and these are under the strictest regulation. The owners of these houses maintain or aid in maintenance of the "wonderfully engineered" city drive upon the heights, the public gardens and other city institutions and asylums, as the price of the privilege they enjoy.

In Gothenburg, Sweden, much the same system obtains—granting the privilege to a society under regulation limiting the number of houses, prescribing their rules of conduct, fixing their sites and fixing also the margin of profit at which sales may be made for the association benefit. All the managers of the houses must work for salary and can have no interest in the sales.

WHAT IT IS DOING.

The Work of the Young Men's Christian Association in This City.

The Young Men's Christian Association of this city very quietly, modestly and without a blowing of trumpets is doing good work. Its rooms on Sixth street, between K and L, any evening will be found well filled with those to whom the comfort and appointments of the apartments are a blessing.

There they find an excellent, new and complete gymnasium and bathrooms, a reading-room with newspapers and magazines in plenty, and writing appliances; a parlor where social and religious meetings are held; and Secretary ready to hear and counsel with any one, and to render those willing to help themselves, and who are sober and manly, advice and assistance in securing employment and obtaining necessities of life where misfortune has fallen upon the seeker.

The association needs about \$600 more than it has subscribed to complete the amount for the support of the institution to October 31, 1892, and the belief is entertained that the association is doing, that from October 1st to December 31st, thirteen young men's meetings were held, with a total attendance of 1,218.

In the physical department in that quarter the senior class met 17 times, with an average attendance of 23; intermediate class 13, with an average of 16; leader's class 5, with an average of 4; business men's class 17, with an average of 12; junior's class 10, with an average attendance of 13; 1,111 baths were furnished in the quarter in this department.

In the three months the attendance at the rooms was 9,334, or an average of 101.01. Letters written by young men in the rooms, 529; notices received at the rooms for young men 527. Applicants directed to proper boarding places and rooms 16; employment secured for 35; moral instruction 21; committee meetings 12; directors' meetings 5; new members received 76; renewals 21; juniors 16. Received from subscriptions and membership \$1,129 50; expended per budget \$1,124 28; balance on hand December 31, 1891, \$5 22.

The association has the assistance of a Woman's Auxiliary Society that proves of great usefulness. The association subsists upon membership fees and annual subscriptions, and if the latter at all fail the work is crippled; in fact they ought to be very much larger to enable the Secretary to enlarge the work and to do more than can now be accomplished in the legitimate sphere of the society.
