

FUNDED DEBT COMMISSION.

Should It be Abolished, or Allowed to Continue?

D. A. Lindley Does Some Figuring on the Subject—Claim That the Commission Can Save \$160,000.

There was a meeting yesterday of the sub-committee appointed by the Freeholders to inquire into the status of the Funded Debt Commission, and to report as to what the effect would be if the commission were to be abolished one year hence, compared to that of allowing it run until the city debt should, in the natural course of events, be paid or absorbed by it.

At the request of Freeholder Hall, D. A. Lindley submitted a statement prepared by him for the committee's consideration, which statement is given below.
