

RAILROAD EXTENSION.

Prospect of New Roads in Yolo, Lake and Humboldt.

Mendocino County Also Likely to Have Railroad Communication Soon.

[Woodland Daily Democrat, March 25th.] Interviews with most of the leading business men of Woodland have satisfied us that with practical unanimity they are heartily in sympathy with the project to induce Mr. Huntington to build a road from Woodland that will connect with the Vaca Valley and Clear Lake Railway at Madison. ...

Within the next two years, if at all, Woodland must make her impress upon California. No ordinary degree of industrialism can retard its growth and prosperity or prevent it from growing in wealth and population and developing into what, by reason of its peculiar advantages and surroundings, the wealth of soil and the abundance of natural resources upon which it is dependent, nature intended it should be, the wealthiest and most prosperous and possibly the most prominent city in California. ...
