In this consideration you will observe we have not included that other nuisance demanding correction, which leaves upon the gravelled streets that have packed, cobble that are bowlders, stones as large as the head of a man, to lie upon the grade to the destruction of vehicles, the crippling of horses, and that render driving after nightfall dangerous. These, it will occur to you, when this other matter of sidewalk nuisances is disposed of, may be removed by the chain-gang.

This sidewalk matter, however, is one which you can correct without leaving your seats, which cannot be longer neglected without confessing that you have no regard for the ordinances you pass, and do not expect them to be observed. It is a matter which we are convinced you will now take up, not because a newspaper has suggested it, but because the subject having been thus publicly broached, and having been freely commented upon by Eastern visitors, is of public concern and worthy of immediate attention and an official order from you that it should be perilous to disobey.

THE atrocious murderer Deeming was, under English rule, arrested in March, tried in April, convicted in May, and hanged before the month expired. It is such process of swift justice that strikes terror to the criminal heart; such certainty of punishment that restrains the murderous hand. Under our mild and too-merciful system the case of Deeming might have thus read upon the register of his prison: Arrested in March, 1892; brought up for preliminary examination in May; case continued to June 15th; again continued to July 15th; examination had in August, committed for trial in September; indicted in November; brought up for arraignment in December; given time to plead until January, 1893; demurred to indictment in February; argument on same postponed from time to time until April; ruling of the court in May; plea in June; trial set for July, continuance until December; trial and conviction in January, 1894. Application for new trial from January to April; appeal from order refusing new trial taken in April. Case set up in May, heard in August, decided in October. Rehearing application made, and not decided until January, 1894; day of execution fixed forty days distant; prisoner executed late in February—that is to say, in the meantime, by reason of delay, death of witnesses and blundering of prosecuting officials he does not slip through the meshes of the law.

WILL GET A NEW TRIAL. The Supreme Court Reverses a Conviction for Murder.

A Tehama Case in Which the Defendant Was Convicted on Circumstantial Evidence.

The Supreme Court has filed its decision in Deputy Clerk Govan's office in this city in the case of the People vs. Rubie Mitchell, appellant. Rubie Mitchell was convicted of murder in the second degree, and appealed from the judgment and refusal of a new trial.

It appears that Oscar Crandall was fatally shot about midnight on April 23, 1891, near Rathja's saloon, in the town of Red Bluff, Crandall, who had been in the saloon, went out upon the back porch, where he was engaged for a time in imitating Chinese talk. Two or three minutes after he went out Rathja heard the report of a pistol and went upon the back porch, but saw no one. The back yard was surrounded by a high fence. The saloon was at the corner of Main and Hickory streets, facing on Main. It was bright moonlight, and except as obstructed by the fence, Rathja could see both streets.

Two witnesses claimed to have been eyewitnesses of the affray. Preston, who testified for the prosecution, was 224 feet away, westerly, on Hickory street. He was positive that he recognized the defendant's voice, but could distinguish no one by sight. To save the fish of the pistol, and the person who fired it ran off south along the alley back of the yard which encloses Rathja's back porch.

This was all the direct testimony against Mitchell, but there was considerable circumstantial evidence. Defendant claimed, and testified, as did several other witnesses, that he was at home, about half a block from Rathja's saloon, administering what he called a "shot" of morphine to one Boyden, who he heard the report and was told that someone was shot, and then ran across the street with Boyden, found the wounded man, and he and Boyden took up the body and carried it to the front of the saloon.

Hughes and Boyden both corroborated Mitchell's story. A great conflicting evidence was introduced in regard to the time of the shooting, and as to Mitchell's whereabouts, and considerable hearsay evidence taken in which the Supreme Court says should have been excluded, as well as some plainly incompetent testimony which charged one H. K. Long with the murder.

After going over the evidence in the case at great length, the Supreme Court says, in conclusion: "Many other points are made by appellant, some of which are at least debatable. They are mostly in regard to attempts at impeachment, or comparatively unimportant matters, the decision of which would not be of importance on a retrial of the cause. We think the judgment and order should be reversed, and a retrial had."

A Week's Failures.
