MINNEAPOLIS DEMANDS A HIGH PROTECTIVE POLICY AT THE HANDS OF THE RAILROADS.

The Minneapolis Chamber of Commerce recently had a hearing before the Interstate Commerce Commission, in which these representatives of the commercial interests of Minneapolis declared that the milling interest of that city wanted the railroads to serve their interests by fixing rates on flour and wheat which would place Minneapolis at an advantage, and competing points at a disadvantage, with reference to the manufacture of flour.

THE DUTY OF THE TRUSTEES. The City Trustees should this morning, by appropriate resolution, appoint J. B. Rodgers Chief of Police. It can do no possible harm and will go very far towards preventing demoralization of the police force, which is inevitable if the men are left to be badgered by this, that and the other influences that may be brought to bear upon them.

As matters now stand Mr. Rodgers is to be put to heavy expense to appeal and to stay proceedings in order to maintain his position, and this must cripple him in doing duty as Chief. To compel him to do so is not therefore just or in the interests of good government; let the board of trustees look at this.

Let those unfamiliar with the technicalities of railroading understand at this point that the maximum rate is found on wheat, that is, the maximum the traffic will bear and move, it cannot be raised; that just as soon as the maximum is reached the maximum rate on wheat in California is \$4 per ton.

This being understood, Minneapolis objects to carrying wheat to Duluth at a lower rate than at the same rate that it is carried to Minneapolis. To quote the Railway Review:

It is also asserted that the rate on wheat from producing points to Minneapolis, added to the rate on flour from Minneapolis to Duluth, is such as to make it impossible for the Minneapolis millers to lay down their flour in Duluth in competition with the mills located at that point, and that in consequence, there is danger that the milling interest concentrated at Minneapolis will suffer material loss.

Reducing this to common terms, the freight rate on wheat to Minneapolis, added to the rate on flour from Minneapolis to Duluth, as compared with the rate on wheat from the points of growth to Duluth, is such as will enable Duluth to manufacture flour; that is all there is of the statement.

Now comes Minneapolis to ask, and again we quote the Railway Review, as follows:

itself would not dare to exercise. Every petition that is sent to a railroad proceeds from selfishness, whether in Minnesota or California. What everybody asks is that the thing they raise shall have some discrimination in its favor; that the point of their location shall have some discrimination in its favor. This Minneapolis instance is broadly illustrative of the spirit of the whole business from first to last.

The very truth underlying this whole subject is that Federal regulation of railroads is the inevitable goal of railroad management in this country. The influence which freight rates have upon the distribution of production, the power it may exert over the fortunes of men and over the destiny of localities, are such as are not to be entrusted to a private agency.

"In times past, and before the construction of certain lines of railway, a large milling interest established itself at Minneapolis. The further development of lines of transportation produced conditions favorable to the concentration of a milling interest at Duluth. Duluth possesses advantages which in a competitive sense endanger the supremacy of Minneapolis as a flour manufacturing point.

This is exactly the spirit in which all cities are approaching railways. Los Angeles demands the right to be a through point against San Bernardino, so that Los Angeles may be the distributing point for San Bernardino.


