A LESSON AND A PROPOSITION.

For the month of October the health reports show that the mortality was the lowest in this city known for several years, and that the sanitary condition was remarkably good. This was due unquestionably to the cholera scare of August and September, the result of which was general cleaning of premises, cleansing of drains and cesspools, and removal of decaying matter, supplemented by disinfection of premises and stricter enforcement of the sanitary laws.

The questions very naturally suggest themselves: "Why should the city return to its former state, and why should it not be kept in good sanitary condition all the time?" There is not only no reason why it should relapse, but every reason why it should not. It can be made the rule, as well as not, that every day and week of the year shall have a good sanitary record.

We may add that the advisory plan proposed has the approval of distinguished engineers, physicians and clear-headed financiers, and last year had the hearty approval of the Street Commissioner.

IS OUR VOTE-COUNTING SYSTEM WRONG?

It is becoming more and more the conviction of Californians that it will be wise to adopt into our election system the New York method of counting votes—with some modifications, perhaps.

Let us suppose the late San Francisco election to be held again and under the better system, instead of incompetent and in some cases intoxicated Boards of Election holding the ballots for days and stretching out the count to the last moment of endurance, a distinct body of officers would count the vote as cast.

Let us suppose that in each polling place there are put in position four ballot-boxes, all sealed before the opening of the polls, and after public examination. That the boxes shall be so arranged as to receive not to exceed sixty votes each; that as soon as box No. 1 receives its quota, one of the board, accompanied by a proper official guard, carries the box to a given place, where a Board of Counters proceeds at once to count the ballots, none of the first board being present, but the count being conducted in the public presence.

In the meantime ballots are being cast in box No. 2, and when it receives its quota, it also is taken to the official counters, and so on until box four is reached. This last might be counted, as an additional precaution by the Board of Election, or, as in the case of the others, taken to the official counters.

As soon as thirty votes are counted from a box the counters should be required to announce the result and record it. This would be but a momentary pause, since the tally sheets by column heads show the totals in each line with each group of five tally marks.

By this, or some similar means, the liability of an Election Board manipulating the ballots, as it is claimed has been done in San Francisco, would be greatly reduced. After the announcement of the group totals of thirty, alteration of the ballots would be next to impossible.

Thus two purposes would be conserved, the prevention of fraud and the rapidity of counting. Under this system in two hours after an election the actual result would be known to the people at large. The vicious would be almost wholly excluded from the opportunity to defraud the voters by doctoring returns, or as it is charged is done in San Francisco, mutilating the ballots as they are handled, for the reason that the counting board would be likely to discover trickery and there would be less liability of two boards conspiring to a common end than the members of one board.

The details we have outlined we do not advance as perfect by any means; they are merely suggestive. Certainly it does Californians no credit whatever that they are unable to ascertain their election results for ten or twelve days after the close of the polls, while in New York, an hour or two after, the whole vote is counted and the totals footed and announced.


