Change for the Worse in the Grain Market Situation.

Heavy Drop in Wheat From Saturday's Quotations—Vegetables in Good Supply.

SAN FRANCISCO, January 9th. The situation changed for the worse in the grain market this morning, and advices from all over the world showed a lower range of prices. The receipts still keep piling up in the East, and to-day they were estimated at 710,493 bushels, as against 600,000 bushels on Saturday. This is about the average rate of increase for some time past, and the surplus accumulation for the month will, it is expected, bring the stocks above 50,000,000 of bushels. On the other hand, the demand in wheat options made a heavy drop from Saturday's quotations, and the decline in May advanced about 1/2c. The total sales were 1,700 tons all of May, at from \$1.35 to \$1.37. Business was very light in barley and only 900 tons changed hands at from \$6.85 to \$7. In spot wheat markets were quiet and lower. The vegetable market is fairly well supplied with early varieties from the southern portion of the State. Cucumbers, Beans, still offered at from \$2.50 to \$3.00 per dozen. Potatoes are in fair demand and prices hold up well. Good Onions are firm and active. There are no other changes reported.
