

RUSHING THE FILE.

First Reading Lists Were Finished Up Saturday.

The Sheriff's Fee Bill Beaten Again—Resolutions on the Death of Assemblyman Price—Another Batch of New Bills—A Reform Resolution Rejected.

Geofford made another "fight" in the Senate Saturday to reduce Sheriff's fees by taking from that office the receivership perquisites. On Friday he made an impassioned speech against the substitute bill, which leaves these fees with the Sheriff and he declared in stentorian tones that Sullivan and Dwyer of San Francisco would be the same to rob the City Treasury of that city. He had been approached, he said, by the new Sheriff of San Francisco, and told to "come off" with his objections. He made just another sort of a speech Saturday in support of his motion to reconsider the vote by which his pet measure was defeated. He had an amendment providing that the law should not go into effect until 1894, hoping thus to quiet Sheriff McLane of San Francisco, who has been lobbying against the proposition like a Trojan. But the Senate rejected the amendment, and then reiterated its vote of the previous Saturday. The joint committee appointed to draft resolutions on the death of Assemblyman E. B. Price of State reported to both houses Saturday. Their resolutions were as follows:

Resolved, by the Senate and Assembly of the State of California, that in the death of E. B. Price, a member of the Legislature, the people of the State of California have lost a diligent, faithful and patriotic public servant, a citizen who in public as well as in private life, barred self and out of sight and brought for the benefit of his fellow citizens every truth he came across, no matter how small or how insignificant it might seem, and who was ever ready to sacrifice his life for the good of his country. Resolved, That copies of these resolutions be transmitted to his family and be entered in the journals of the Senate and Assembly.

SATURDAY'S PROCEEDINGS.

Sheriff's Fees Will Stand—More New Bills.

The Senate convened at 10 a. m. Saturday, with Lieutenant-Governor Reddick the chair and a quorum present. The Committee on Claims reported favorably on the claims of Michael Denzer and others who were injured by the collapse of seats at the State Fair grounds.

Senator Ostrom offered a resolution to appropriate money to pay for telegraphing to Washington to have a telegram sent to the break in the Feather River. It was adopted.

Senator Mathews introduced a resolution abolishing the resolution requiring members to introduce and take up bills out of order, after next Thursday. The resolution was defeated.

The following new bills were introduced: By Voorhies—Making an appropriation of \$16,000 to build and furnish a residence for the Governor and his family.

By Mathews—Relative to the improvement of navigable streams and protection of land adjacent thereto.

By Wilson—Relative to liability of railway corporations.

By Flint—To appropriate \$15,000 to complete the restoration and preservation of Sutter's Fort.
