COMPULSORY ARBITRATION. The suggestion is renewed that Congress should legislate to make industrial arbitration compulsory.

The theoretical view of the question that is now being pushed to the front at the East is unquestionably strong, and there is no man living, probably, who would not rejoice in such a condition as the theory argues must be the outcome.

If the judgment of national arbitrators ran against the employer, it would be without vigor unless back of it stood the power of the Government to enforce the decree—that is, to compel the manufacturer to run his works, or to forbid him operating them.
