A NEW AND CHEAPER SEWAGE DISPOSAL DEVICE.

The chemical precipitation method of disposing of sewage is the means employed at the World's Fair for treatment of the sewage of grounds occupied by from one hundred thousand to three hundred and fifty thousand people daily.

At Worcester the sewage is discharged by an outfall sewer into a precipitating settling tank, and thence successively into three others, where the matter is treated. The sludge finally settled, is taken out from the last of the tanks, the effluent being drawn off.

At the World's Fair the process is to convey the sewage to tanks, each being vertical and fifty feet deep by a diameter of thirty-two feet. In the center of each is a thirty-foot pipe six feet across, and at its base are pipe arms radiating in eight directions to the sides of the tank.

The sewage is conducted to the drum of the central stand pipe and overflows the strainer, and thence goes by the fourteen-inch pipes to the tank stand pipes, and through the radiating arms of which it is distributed through the tank.

The chemicals are added and mixed in en route. The solid matter settles to the bottom of each tank, having en route been thoroughly mixed by its travel and by mixer devices. The liquid rises of course to the tops of the tanks, and overflows into troughs which convey the purified water away.

This apparatus treats 8,640,000 gallons of sewage every twenty-four hours at a cost of \$5 for chemicals per each 100,000 gallons. From six to eight men are required to work the plant, and the entire area occupied by it is but 100x125 feet.

Now, when chemical disposition of sewage has been brought down to such cheapness, and can be introduced for so low a cost, is there any reason whatever for Sacramento delaying any longer in adopting a new sewage disposal system?

lish the plant and it will cost no more—indeed not so much—to lift from its tanks than it now costs to lift at Ninth and Y streets from the pestilential disease breeding hole in the ground.

ANOTHER DEMAND FOR THE STATE CAPITAL.

The Oakland Times in a labored editorial considers San Jose "knocked out" in the attempt to remove the Capital from Sacramento. It then proceeds to say that Oakland should begin preparations to put on foot in the next Legislature the necessary movement to have the seat of government removed to Oakland.

There is the usual and pardonable boasting about the advantages of Oakland as to accessibility, centrality, etc., but not a single line is printed to show that there is any necessity whatever for a change of the seat of government; that there is any demand by the people for it, or that there is any economic or even sentimental reason for disturbing the location.

The truth is that there is nothing whatever except the notion of local aggrandizement to prompt even the suggestion of a change in the location of the seat of government. The Times says:

We do not believe that there is the least doubt of success if we wisely persist in our intention. We believe that if the matter is properly presented to the people of California and properly manipulated, Oakland will within the next four years be declared the Capital of California.

In this expression there is simply the reflection of local ambition. State necessity, State good, the welfare of the taxpayers of California, are no figure whatever. It is a very short-sighted policy on the part of any influence, in Oakland or anywhere else, to project this question of Capital removal into another campaign after the San Jose ambition shall have been disposed of.

VERY good, exceptionally and thoroughly systematic work is in progress at Oakland for stamping out the fever epidemic. But how much better it would have been to have so administered affairs that an epidemic would not have assailed the city.

Over 350 sick people might have escaped the plague, and those now dead from the fever would probably be in life and doing duty in the community. If the milk supplied from Claremont was the cause originally, it proves that Oakland needed a food inspector; if the ill condition of the sewers is chargeable with the continuance of the epidemic, it proves that there has long been official neglect to examine the city drains and ascertain their condition.

Sever examination in a city should be constant; the exact condition of the sewers should be known and reported each week in a city so large as is Oakland. The city authorities must have known all the time that the sewers of ten streets in West Oakland empty into a pond that has no outlet, and that this pond had not been cleaned in a long, long time.

Now they are about to cut canals from this pestilential pond to the bay. Naturally, prudent people will ask why these canals were not cut long ago? Was it not next door to criminal negligence to store the sewage from a large section in the pond bounded by Union, Kirkham, Third and Fifth streets?

Yet such a supposititious case is precisely the parallel of the Oakland situation. All this should warn us to at once cleanse the low-lying section beyond R street below Ninth.

A EUROPEAN critic says in a foreign review: Two conspicuous characteristics mark the American newspaper superficiality. It seems black with headlines. It is padded to faltering repetition with unimportant and unwholesome verbiage in a style of imitable bombast.

As to the amount of truth in this criticism we take it there will hardly be two opinions among conservative people. It is a thought worthy the serious consideration of journalists, that the American newspaper press is lacking in seriousness and is inflated by sensationalism. To the correction of these defects we believe the best journalistic thought and influence of the country must very soon address itself.

AND now the San Francisco Examiner joins the column in the war upon "ladies' entrances" to saloons. Seven of the Supervisors of San Francisco, with Mayor Elliott, are out in letters denouncing the ladies' entrances to bill-boards and demanding that they be prohibited. It really begins to look as if society might at last dissolve the infamous partnership it now has with these ante-rooms to crime and drive in. If women will drink let them be driven to using the front door of the saloon, and to standing up to the open bar along with men.


