COMMERCIAL.

Business Suspended in San Francisco Saturday on Account of Holiday.

SACRAMENTO, September 10th. Although yesterday was a holiday, business was carried on in produce circles, and trade was quite good. At San Francisco business was suspended yesterday. In the early part of the morning there was some trading in Produce, but it was of very small proportions. The banks, public offices, stock and produce exchanges were closed all day, and there were but few visitors to the Mercantile Exchange to ascertain the condition of Eastern and foreign markets.

Retail prices for the various named in the local markets are as follows: GREEN FRUITS—Apples—Green, 3c @ 4c; Yellow King, 3c; Red, 3c.
