THEY WERE TOO LATE.

A Sacramento Case Decided by the Supreme Court. The Supreme Court has rendered a decision in the case of Herman Hoppe and others, plaintiffs and appellants, against Julia Hoppe, defendant and appellee, and W. A. Fountain, defendant and respondent, denying a writ of supersedeas to stay proceedings in favor of the appellants.

The plaintiffs brought action for partition against defendants, and the respondent Fountain also brought action for foreclosure of mortgage.

The Superior Court consolidated the actions, entered a decree of foreclosure and appointed a receiver to sell the estate and report to the court, which was done. The plaintiffs gave notice that they would apply to the Supreme Court for a stay of proceedings, but before the day noticed for the hearing the land had been sold, and the bond given by plaintiffs was insufficient to operate as a stay of proceedings. The court holds that even if it had been sufficient the plaintiffs did not make their application in time.
