

COMMERCIAL.

Wheat Situation Unchanged—Trade Dull and Prices Weak.

Steadier Tone to the Barley Market—Higher Prices Asked and Obtained for Choice Feed.

SA. FRANCISCO, October 30th. The wheat situation is unchanged. Trade is dull and prices weak.

The vegetable market is heavily stocked with tomatoes and trade is generally dull, with prices weak.

The poultry market is weak and dull. Game arrivals to-day were light and a large quantity was spoiled by the weather.

The butter market continues to weaken under large arrivals. Eggs are more plentiful with an easier tone in prices.

In fresh fruits the market is unchanged. Grapes are doing a little better, but the demand is weak in comparison with the receipts.

PRODUCE MARKET. FLOUR—Net cash prices for Family Extras, \$3.65 per 75 lb sack.

WHEAT—Quotable at 1 1/2 to 1 3/4 cts. No. 1 soft winter wheat, \$1.07 1/2 to \$1.10 cts.

BARLEY—Feed, 67 1/2 to 72 1/2 cts for fair to good quality, and 71 1/2 to 75 cts for choice bright.

OATS—Milling, \$1.10 to \$1.20; Surplus, \$1.20 to \$1.25; Hay, \$1.15 to \$1.17 1/2.

GRAIN—Trade is generally quiet. Quotable at 80 1/2 to 82 1/2 cts for large yellow, 82 1/2 to 85 cts for small yellow and 85 1/2 to 87 1/2 cts for white.

VEGETABLES—Green Okra, 75c to \$1.00 per box; Egg Plant, 25c to 30c per box.

FRESH FRUIT—Apples, 75c to \$1.00 per box for good to choice, and 35c to 40c for common to fair.
