

MRS. A. B. HUMPHREY'S ESTATE.

It Foots Up a Very Comfortable Figure.

Her Will Filed for Probate—\$140,000 to be Divided Between Her Husband and Children.

A. B. Humphrey of Mayhew Station has petitioned the Superior Court, by his attorneys, Holl & Dunn, for the probate of the will of his deceased wife, who died recently at Oakland.

The estate consists of 2,400 acres of land in Stanislaus County, valued at \$70,000; interest in fruit ranch at Mayhew Station, \$20,000; one-ninth interest in the estate of John W. Jones, deceased, in San Joaquin, Stanislaus and Tuolumne Counties, \$50,000; one-sixth interest in will for \$100,000 pending against R. W. Wilhoit, guardian of said John W. Jones (value unknown).

The will of deceased names her husband, A. B. Humphrey, as executor of the estate, and said A. B. Humphrey, Georgiana Camp of Perks, William H. Hall and Alice M. Ross (formerly Alice M. Hall) of Stanislaus, Catherine M. Farmer of Sacramento City, and Bessie Bird Humphrey and Winnifred Eleas Humphrey of Mayhew are named as devisees and legatees of the deceased.

The following bequests are made by testator: To A. B. Humphrey, one-ninth of the State of Texas and the fruit ranch at Mayhew Station.

To her son, William Hall, no portion of the estate is left, for the reason that he had been amply provided for by his father.

To her daughter, Georgiana E. Camp, wife of Charles Camp, an undivided one-fifth of the residue of the estate.

To her daughter, Alice Hall, the same portion.

To her husband, A. B. Humphrey, the remaining three-fifths, to be held in trust for certain purposes. After defraying all the expenses, the net income of one-third to be paid annually to Catherine M. Farmer, her daughter, or to her issue (should she die before the executor) until his death, when one-third shall vest immediately in the children of Mrs. Farmer then living. Should the executor die first, then another trustee shall be selected. Should Catherine M. Farmer die without issue, the one-third shall vest in such children of testator as may then be living, share and share alike, and in the issue of any deceased daughter such share as the latter would have received if living. In the event of a legal separation at any time between Mrs. Farmer and her husband, the said one-third shall immediately vest in her.

The rents, profits, etc., of the other two-thirds of the said three-fifths are to be collected and used by said A. B. Humphrey until Bessie Bird Humphrey (testator's daughter) shall reach the age of 25 years, when she shall receive one-half of the said two-thirds. An equal portion shall be held in trust for the benefit of Winnifred Eleas Humphrey (another daughter) until she shall reach the age of 25 years. It is further provided, however, that if the testator or devisee named should prefer to do so, he may apportion them their full shares after reaching the age of 18 years.

Provision is made for the disposition of the bequests to the younger daughters in case of their death before maturity. As to the three-fifths held in trust by her husband, the testator provides that it may be disposed of as he sees fit and proper, and the proceeds thereof to be held in trust as aforesaid. If any of the legatees or devisees should contest the validity of the will, or any of its provisions, such person or persons shall thereupon forfeit all right to any share thereof, and it shall be equally divided among the others.

The will concludes: "I hereby give the executor of this, my last will and testament, full and sole authority to grant, bargain, sell and convey, at either public or private sale, all or any part of my estate, without any order of court whatsoever, and he is not to be held liable for any such sale."

The matter has been set for hearing on Friday, the 30th instant.

SOCIALISTIC IDEAS.

How They Are Growing in the Great Eastern Cities.

The Great Contest Will Really be Between the Labor Leaders and the Socialists.

[Special Correspondence of Record-Union.] New York, March 11.—Three days of bright, warm sunshine this week strewed the snow-covered streets and houses with blinking jewels, drove into the parks and driveways hundreds of ponies with phaetons filled with the women and children of Fifth avenue, and on the dreary east-side the people swarmed out of the tenements upon the streets. Weakly mothers with blue babies perched on the fire-escapes, looked at the sunshine. There was a pleasing picture everywhere one looked, pious at times, but always a relief after the dismal season of a winter naturally mild, but humanly hard. If one could stop with the satisfaction expressed even in the tossing heads of the ladies' ponies or the mischievous snow-pelting of the boys, this letter would be full of sunshine. But I have set out to tell some of the troublesome things that are to be expected when the crop of the winter comes to fruition.

A man named Feeny stopped me in the street yesterday and asked me why the newspaper men were letting the labor difficulties so much alone. Did they not know that the labor troubles were not so bad, but they are brewing trouble that will fill columns. Mr. Feeny is the State Labor Commissioner. His chief anxiety is to compromise strikes and lockouts. But he told me yesterday that he had been studying the unions all over the State, visiting unions, and men and occasionally with an employer.

"Yes, sir," he said, "All the material resources of labor are being used up, and three years have been lost during the hard times. Wages have been cut down as well as time, and, as everybody knows, the more you cut down on wages, the more you cut down on the quality of work. Well, workmen have submitted in all but a few cases to these reductions, knowing it was useless to fight. Many have gone to the other boys' production, and were kept at work, so that competition among themselves has both facilitated the reductions and increased them. Discontent is growing, and the danger of a reckoning is widespread. This has been the fulcrum on which labor leaders have raised their powers, added to their organizations, and, in some cases, to their will. It is this fulcrum that has enabled them to talk, and, too, thought.
