

BLOODSHED IN SAMOA. Contention Between Rival Native Tribes Continues. THIRTY KILLED AND FIFTY OTHERS CRUELLY MAIMED.

Houses Burned, Women and Children Maltreated, and the Most Horrible Barbarities Committed—President Dole of the Provisional Government at Hawaii Engaged in Drawing Up a New Constitution for the Islands.

Special to the RECORD-UNION. SAN FRANCISCO, April 13.—The steamship Monowai, which arrived this afternoon, brought Samoan advices up to March 28th, fully confirming the Associated Press cablegrams from Auckland which announced the renewal of hostilities among the Samoan natives.

SAMOA BLOOD AGAIN SHEED. APIA (SAMOA), April 13.—Samoa blood has again been shed. Since early in March there has been a bloody contention between the rival native tribes, and already over thirty natives have been killed and fifty cruelly maimed.

Another important official change is anticipated. Harsh Hitechock will probably retire in a short time on account of illness. He has been in charge of the police bureau for over a year and has given great satisfaction. It is believed he was nearly ruined during last December, when it was thought that force was to be used for the restoration of the Queen, and during that trying time he worked night and day.

News has reached here via Auckland that the United States has decided to improve Pearl Harbor, with the intention of establishing a naval station there. The fact that Admiral Irwin is at present at Pearl Harbor with his aids taking soundings and making surveys lends color to the report. This is his second visit on the same mission in six weeks.

The American Union party, although in complete control of Honolulu, has not yet decided to attack the Islands of Maui and Hawaii, the largest islands of the group. The annexationists there, who are all connected with the plantations, have strenuously objected to the plan to take the platform which excludes Chinese labor. The planters are fighting this tooth and nail and have formed party clubs, under the old platform, providing for Asiatic labor under proper restrictions.

The newly-elected Central Committee of the American Union party has begun its work by the registration of voters for the franchise, having passed a stringent resolution to that effect at its first meeting. All the party clubs have passed resolutions to the same effect, and still claim that they are entitled to recognition and will have rights equal to those of other foreigners.
