ROCKS AND SHOALS OF THE ROAD CONVENTION. The State Road Convention has been called by the Executive Committee to convene in San Francisco, May 24th.

The Record-Union and Weekly Union are the only papers on the Coast, outside of San Francisco, that receive the full Associated Press Dispatches from all parts of the world.

The State Road Convention will do nothing, can do nothing but talk, unless it agrees upon a plan whereby good road systems can be put into operation under engineering supervision.

The opponents of the bonding system propose as a substitute direct taxation. That is to say, if a county needs a given number of miles of trunk roads to be constructed at general cost, and the output for the same is to be \$500,000, that sum should be taken by special tax direct from the pockets of the taxpayers of the present generation.

But if this plan of direct taxation will not be accepted, then the bond opponents propose that so much of good-road general trunk lines be built each year as can be done with a small sum added annually to the tax for the general fund in each county.

These are in brief, immediate enhancement of real values and consequent decrease of the tax rates; the lessening of distance of travel and consequent saving of time to producers; the narrowing of the capital invested in teams and vehicles, and the current expense of their maintenance; the betterment of rural conditions, and therefore the strengthening of the invitation to rural home living; the improvement of facilities of transportation, mail delivery, etc.; the lowering of the cost of annual road repairs; the abolition of the expensive system of district repairing upon main lines.

These are but a few of the direct benefits which must follow good road construction, and exclude the potential social benefits. The simple question is, is it wise to build a system at once on borrowed money, to be paid back by all the beneficiaries, or to do without the good road benefits? or, to build by piece-meal? or, to cast the whole burden of construction upon the tax-payers of one, two or three years?

A thing the convention should avoid is the turning of itself into a road building kindergarten. Good economic road building is now a science. It has been settled just what a good road is, what should be its grade, crown, sub-structure and roof. If the convention delegates are to come up as they did last year, and expect to be taught in one lesson how to build a good road, the time of the convention will be wasted. If its hours are to be squandered in listening to A, B, C and D's antiquated ideas how a good road should be made of gravel or dirt or slag, or how high it should be crowned, or how flat it should be made, and whether

this, that or the other kind of road material is best to be used, then it were better the convention had not been called together. Engineering science, experience in other States and countries, have settled just what classes of roads are good roads. To spend days now in a promiscuous convention in debates between men most of whom have not studied the question in modern lights will be to waste time.

It is with all due respect to the delegates that we say as much, and without any intention whatever to give offense. What we mean to say is that the convention should be mainly one of ways and means, and that it should leave to counties and road engineering science all matters relating to construction and most questions as to what constitutes a good road.

LABOR NOT ANARCHISTIC. THE RECORD-UNION has held constantly that the real workman, the man who has a trade, or is skilled in labor; who feels an interest in society, and wishes to preserve the opportunity enlightenment gives for any one to better his condition; who realizes what it is to be a free man, is not and never will be anarchistic. He and his fellow-workmen constitute the very large majority of toilers, and they are not going to be led to paternalism nor driven into it.

The few who embrace radical socialism, who fraternize with anarchists, who shout at revolutionary meetings and applaud threats of lawlessness, are over-estimated as to numbers and influence. By their roaring they make it seem that they are a multitude, and by their presumption and effrontery lead some to believe that they are commissioned to voice the sentiment of labor.

Thus far in all the attempts to stir the laboring classes to acts of violence against orderly government with a view of overthrowing it, and substituting the theories of visionaries and communistic idealists, have failed; the true work, bone and sinew, the brawn and brain of the labor ranks have not taken part to an extent that is sufficient to commit the wage-earners to the cause of violence, disorder and rebellion.

In most strikes in this country the leaders in violence have had the following only of low foreigners who have no regard for American institutions, and no absolute license to give rein to their brutish will. There have been some exceptions in which some of the better class of workers have been led into acts of lawlessness, but these exceptions only prove the rule.

In London, on Sunday, the laboring men of the great capital, at the Mayday meetings, not only refused to hear anarchistic and revolutionary speakers, but when they attempted to voice their inflammatory sentiments the workmen fell upon them, and but for the interference of the police would have done them serious harm. This repeatedly occurred, and so London was treated to the spectacle of anarchists seeking the protection of the officers of the law they had just denounced, and taking shelter behind the very police they had been urging the people to stab, cut and destroy. Was there ever a sterner rebuke given to the doctrine of the theorist?

It will be precisely the same in this country. When the radical socialists and anarchists, apparently now in antagonism and both seeking to overthrow the laws and set up new, untried and fanciful schemes, come to the front with their open propositions and advice to carry them into effect, the real labor element of the country will be found to be their bitterest opponent. It is not ready, nor will it be, to sacrifice the privileges, liberties and immunities secured to men under this free government, to the vagaries and fancies of idealists and the brutal methods of dynamite advocates and the apostles of violence.

If the reports from Nicaragua are true relative to the trespasses by the Nicaraguan officials upon American rights and property at Bluefields, it will be necessary to extend the strong arm and take the Nicaraguans to task with so sharp a turn as to inspire respect for the United States Government, which evidently the petty State of Central America does not now entertain.
