PUTTING UP THE BARS. There is one order of protection to which the Republican platform commits the party that the RECORD-UNION finds itself in hearty sympathy with.

It is not putting it too strong to say that all immigration of all foreign laborers, skilled or unskilled, should be inhibited. It needs strong, perhaps extreme, declarations upon the subject to bring the nation up to the plane of right action in this direction.

For a long time the RECORD-UNION has been urging upon public attention the duty of "putting up the bars." To just what extent the bars should be put up we have not in detail discussed, as it is necessary first to arouse the people to the actual need of checking the influx of the non-assimilable element, the pauper and degraded labor element, those classes which come to us not for citizenship, not to aid in maintaining and bettering American institutions, but for greed of gain, to under-cut the American labor wage, drive real home builders out of the field and into pauperism, or degrade them to a condition incompatible with the demands of our civilization upon them.

A WOMAN SUFFRAGE PLANK. THE RECORD-UNION cannot approve the woman suffrage plank of the Republican platform. The reasons of this journal have so often advanced against woman suffrage are familiar to all its readers.

We are opposed to woman suffrage in the interest of woman; we oppose it because we believe it to be for her highest and best good that she should not be invested with the responsibility of the grant of the claim by the agitators involves. Neither do we believe that the electors of the State favor the extension asked for.
