SAN FRANCISCO, July 26th. The wheat market keeps easy in tone, while the volume of trade is notably light.

The movement in barley is slow, both in feed and brewing qualities. Some new Salinas oats are coming along just now, being quotable at 85c @ \$1.10 per cwt.

The fresh fruit market is dull with heavy receipts and prices weak. Apples are in large supply. Apricots are doing better. Peaches are firm.

The demand for butter holds firm, and prices are well maintained. Eggs are steady. Cheese is in good supply.


