THE WAR IN THE ORIENT.

A Talk With the New Japanese Minister to Washington.

SETTLEMENT OF THE QUARREL NOT A MATTER OF DAYS AND WEEKS.

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WASHINGTON, Aug. 19.—The Japanese legation has received a telegram announcing that Japan had decided to issue a domestic loan of \$50,000,000.

TACOMA, Aug. 19.—A special to the Ledger from Ocoos says: On Saturday morning, while making a landing through the surf at Jo Creek, fifteen miles north of Gray's Harbor, a whaleboat and crew of nine men, in command of Lieutenant Freeman H. Crosby, U. S. N., of the United States coast survey steamer McCarrin, were captured, and five men are missing, namely: Lieutenant Crosby, John Fryer, Jens Gudmundsen, William Neim and Alexander Smith.

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
