

OBJECT TO HIGHER ASSESSMENTS.

Several Counties Head by the State Equalizers.

Yuba, Colusa, Glenn, Sutter and Yuba Explain Why Theirs Should Stand.

The State Board of Equalization yesterday commenced its hearing of the statements of county officials as to why their assessments should not be raised. Butte County had the first innings and was represented by Supervisor C. T. Reynolds, J. M. Nelson, J. W. Gass, A. C. Norton and Smith.

Mr. Reynolds stated that there had been a general falling off in value, not only in lands, but in other property. The price of land has fallen and there is no sale for it. Even the choice lands around Chico have depreciated with the rest.

Mr. Nelson said that the value of land should be based on its productive power. The land is growing less productive and the price at which it has been held has been steadily decreasing.

Mr. Reynolds instanced well bred horses and colts on the Reavis ranch, which were taken last spring into Nevada and the owner had stated that it was doubtful if he ever went after them, as horses were worth so little.

Mr. Norton said there had been a decrease on realty of 10 per cent. Adobe lands had been sold for some time and had decreased so that land that had been assessed at \$20 per acre will not bring \$5 per acre and could not be mortgaged for that amount.

In the foothills there is no sale for lands, and the only sale known of was for \$1 25 per acre for grazing purposes. Supervisor Hill said that the value of land in the colonies depends on the water rights and improvements.

Mr. Reynolds instanced well bred horses and colts on the Reavis ranch, which were taken last spring into Nevada and the owner had stated that it was doubtful if he ever went after them, as horses were worth so little.

THE DUNSMUIR TRAIN-STEALERS.

They Were Released on the Grand Larceny Charge,

But Fined for Evading Railroad Fares - Then Re-arrested for Obstructing Mails.

The Police Court was crowded with spectators yesterday morning for the examination of E. Seyler, G. B. Coombs, G. F. Helmetz, F. Heckle, M. C. Roberts, George Delinger, H. L. Walther, W. C. Parish, G. W. Massey, J. M. Littlefield and T. M. Price, charged with stealing a locomotive belonging to the Southern Pacific Company, at Dunsmuir, on the Fourth of July.

The locomotive was the one used to bring the train of mail and express to this city. A. L. Hart represented the defendants, and District Attorney Ryan and Judge J. W. Armstrong appeared for the prosecution.

When the case was called the District Attorney said there was a question whether the defendants could be held on the charge placed against them—that of grand larceny—and he asked that the case be dismissed. On his motion Justice Devine dismissed the cases.

That Seyler and the other defendants should not be allowed to go untried for their actions, a motion was made by Timothy Lee, clerk of the court, and by the payment of railroad fares, was filed before the disposition of the original case.
