Wheat Prices Steady Without Being Buoyant.

Barley Offerings Free, Though Custom is Anything But Quick.

SAN FRANCISCO, August 30th. The wheat market lacks spirit, and traders of rather moderate proportions. Prices are steady, without being buoyant.

No change in barley quotations. Offerings are free, though custom is anything but quick.

The recent reduction in asking rates has not brought out any better demand for oats, and the market still drags along in unsatisfactory fashion.

The vegetable market is heavily stocked with tomatoes. Potatoes and onions hold firm.

In fresh fruits there was no change reported outside of firmer prices for freestone peaches. Melons are in heavy supply. Grapes move off slowly.

The weakness in the butter market still continues, and higher grades are reduced in price. Eggs are firm at quotations.

The poultry market is well supplied with all varieties. A carload of Eastern has just been sold.

OFFICIAL. PROCLAMATION. STATE OF CALIFORNIA, EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT, SACRAMENTO, August 29, 1894. Whereas, The Legislature of the State of California, at its thirtieth session, beginning on the second day of January, A. D. 1888, and continuing to the present time, has passed and approved an act to amend the Constitution of the State of California, to-wit:

AMENDMENT NUMBER ONE. A resolution to propose to the people of the State of California an amendment to the Constitution of the State, amending section one of article two thereof, relative to the right of suffrage.

Section 1. Every native male citizen of the United States, every male person who shall have acquired the right of citizenship under or by virtue of the Treaty of Guadalupe, and every male naturalized citizen thereof, who shall have become such ninety days prior to any election, of the age of twenty-one years, who shall have been resident of the State one year next preceding the election, and of the county in which he claims his vote ninety days, and in the election precinct thirty days, shall be entitled to vote at all elections which he now or may hereafter be authorized by law; provided, no native of China, no idiot, no insane person, no person convicted of any infamous crime, no person heretofore convicted of the crime of embezzlement or misappropriation of public money, and no person who shall not be able to read the Constitution in the English language and write his name, shall ever exercise the privileges of an elector in this State; provided, that the provisions of this amendment shall not apply to any person prevented by a physical disability from complying with its requirements, nor to any person who shall be unable to read or write any language, nor to any person who shall be over sixty years of age and upwards at the time this amendment shall take effect.

AMENDMENT NUMBER TWO. Senate Constitutional Amendment No. 14. A resolution proposing to the people of the State of California an amendment to section three of article eleven of the Constitution of the State of California, relating to the formation of new counties.

Section 3. The Legislature, by general and uniform laws, may provide for the formation of new counties; provided, however, that no county shall be created which shall reduce any county to a population of less than eight thousand; nor shall a new county be created which shall reduce any county to a population of less than five thousand; nor shall any line thereof pass within five miles of the county seat of any county proposed to be divided.

AMENDMENT NUMBER THREE. Senate Constitutional Amendment No. 15. A resolution proposing to the people of the State of California an amendment to section three of article eleven of the Constitution of the State of California, relating to the formation of new counties.

Section 3. The Legislature, by general and uniform laws, may provide for the formation of new counties; provided, however, that no county shall be created which shall reduce any county to a population of less than eight thousand; nor shall a new county be created which shall reduce any county to a population of less than five thousand; nor shall any line thereof pass within five miles of the county seat of any county proposed to be divided.

AMENDMENT NUMBER FOUR. Senate Constitutional Amendment No. 16. A resolution proposing to the people of the State of California an amendment to section three of article eleven of the Constitution of the State of California, relating to the formation of new counties.

Section 3. The Legislature, by general and uniform laws, may provide for the formation of new counties; provided, however, that no county shall be created which shall reduce any county to a population of less than eight thousand; nor shall a new county be created which shall reduce any county to a population of less than five thousand; nor shall any line thereof pass within five miles of the county seat of any county proposed to be divided.

AMENDMENT NUMBER FIVE. Senate Constitutional Amendment No. 17. A resolution proposing to the people of the State of California an amendment to section seven, article eleven, of the Constitution of the State of California.

Section 7. City and county governments may be merged and consolidated into one municipal government, with one set of officers, and may be incorporated under general laws providing for the incorporation and organization of incorporations for municipal purposes. The provisions of this Constitution applicable to cities, and also those applicable to counties, so far as not inconsistent or prohibitory thereon, shall be applicable to such consolidated government.

AMENDMENT NUMBER SIX. Senate Constitutional Amendment No. 18. A resolution to propose to the people of the State of California an amendment to the Constitution of the State, amending section nine of article thirteen thereof, relative to the election of a State Board of Equalization.

Section 9. A State Board of Equalization, consisting of one member from each congressional district in the State, shall be elected by the qualified electors of their respective districts at the first general election to be held after the adoption of this amendment, and at each general election every four years, whose term of office shall be for four years, whose duty it shall be to equalize the valuation of
