Large Attendance at the Sheep-head Bay Track.

JOHN COOPER RUNS AWAY FROM YO TAMBINI.

Opening of the Fall Meeting of the Indianapolis Driving Club—Tame Sport at the First Day of the Grand Circuit Races at Fleetwood Park—Events at Latonia, Hawthorne and East St. Louis.

NEW YORK, Sept. 3.—In spite of threatening weather the attendance at Sheep-head Bay was as large as the usual holiday crowd, but the racing was by no means up to the standard. When the scratching was over it could be seen the greatest havoc had been made with the Labor Day handicap, a mile and a quarter, for only five had been left out of the original fourteen, and Yo Tambini was an even money favorite. John Cooper was the second choice and Saragossa third, while few wanted to bet on the others at any price. There was a delay at the post, due to the bad behavior of Yo Tambini, who would not join her field, but after a while she concluded to break. At the end of the first mile Pocahontas had run herself into the ground, and gave it up, while Hyderabad was in the same condition. Next was Yo Tambini, and then Cooper came away from the lot as if they were standing still, and won easily from Saragossa.

A BLAZE AT ANGELS CAMP.

Half a Block in the Business Portion Destroyed by Fire.

ANGELS CAMP, Sept. 3.—A fire started in the Stockton House last night, burning it to the ground beside one-half a block in the business portion of town. The loss is \$40,000; insurance \$15,500.

The Stockton Lodge-house, Marshall's saloon, the Golden Eagle Hotel and bakery, Swain's jewelry store and gully, Jack's hardware store, Ratz' barber shop, Mrs. Crooks' lodging-house, Brunner's cigar store, Sol King's saloon, Otto Fleischer's, William Smith's lodging-house were burned. The partially-damaged buildings are the Angels Hotel, Odd Fellows' Hall and G. B. Allen's general merchandise store.

It is thought to have been the work of an incendiary. J. B. Swain and a watchman who first discovered the fire dis- covered the kerosene, and no other reason can be given for the fire increasing as fast as it did.

It is claimed that a man and a woman were caught by and perished in the flames.

A SWINDLER APPREHENDED.

Did His Associates Up for a Vast Sum of Money.

CHICAGO, Sept. 3.—A. W. Wilcox of Chicago, who is charged with swindling his business associates out of a vast sum of money, has been apprehended in Buffalo at the instance of his former partner, Charles N. Coddling of New York and F. S. Pasley of Philadelphia, and taken to New York City. Wilcox was formerly located in Chicago and had an office in the Omaha building. He lived with his wife at 129 Ohio street. According to the detectives Wilcox is a peculiar and eccentric man, a long bank account and a farm of the ordinary kind being the share of this world's goods. His apprehension is for alleged extensive defalcations from his partners. The sum in question is not definitely known, but it is supposed to be about \$100,000. It is believed that Wilcox will be able to make a settlement with Coddling and Pasley which will result in having criminal action against him withdrawn.

Reciprocity Treaty Cancelled.

MADRID, Sept. 3.—The Gazette published to-day a decree cancelling the reciprocity treaty between the United States and Cuba, the cancellation to take effect the moment the United States applies the new customs tariff. Instructions have been sent to the Spanish colonies that cargoes which were cleared from the United States before the new tariff went into effect should pay the old rate of duty. Negotiations are now pending for a new commercial treaty between the United States and the Spanish colonies.

Cargo of a Brig Plundered.

LAS PALMAS (Canary Islands), Sept. 3.—Advices received here from Cape Juby, opposite the Island of Fuerteventura, on the Caraha Coast, say that a band of Kabyles attacked an English brig while the latter was loading a cargo at the English factory at Cape Juby. The cargo of the brig was plundered by Kabyles, who wounded several of the English employees of the factory. The latter took refuge on the brig.

Instantly Killed.

STOCKTON, Sept. 3.—John William Burnett, who lives on Roberts Island, was instantly killed this morning by being thrown under the wheels of a wagon loaded with wheat, which he was driving to town.



We have seen some of the United States just as good sheep as any in Australia. The only element lacking to successful competition on the part of the American farmer is the American aversion to cheapness, except on the part of the Democratic free-traders, who would cheapen everything that produces by cheapening the value of the labor that produces it.
