

ADJOURNMENT OF THE PRESBYTERY.

The Business of Its Session Concluded Yesterday.

Chico Selected as the Place for the Next Meeting—Ordination of a Minister.

The Sacramento Presbytery met at the Fourteenth-street Presbyterian Church at 9:30 o'clock yesterday morning, with all the delegates present.

Rev. F. L. Nash of Carson City was enrolled as a member. Elder A. D. Cuts of Marysville was also enrolled.

Permission was given the Marysville, Dixon, Elk Grove and Davisville Churches to supply their pulpits for the next six months.

Rev. J. N. McClain was appointed moderator for Dixon and Fremont.

Dr. J. E. Eastman and Felix Tracy were appointed a committee to draft suitable resolutions on the death of the late Rev. George P. Tindall, formerly pastor of the Fourteenth-street Presbyterian Church of this city.

Reports were then read by the Chairman of standing committees. Dr. Eastman reported for the Home Missions Committee, Rev. E. Graham for Foreign Missions Committee, Rev. J. N. McClain for the Board of Ministerial Relief, Rev. W. B. Cumming for the Committee of Systematic Benevolence, and Rev. K. M. Stevenson for the Committee on Christian Endeavor.

Rev. Mr. Graham presented an overture, which will be acted upon at the synod, which meets in Los Angeles today. The overture, if adopted by the synod, will give pastors in settled churches and professors in theological seminaries, and presbytery and synodical missionaries, and elders representing churches, first claim to the synod's mileage fund.

Conway B. Rodgers was then ordained as a minister of the Presbyterian Church. After the singing of a hymn, the ordination was administered to Mr. Rodgers, and while the ministers present laid their hands on the new candidate's head, reports were offered by the Moderator, Rev. Mr. Baugh, Rev. Mr. Eastman then delivered a sermon "On the Office of the Minister as a Preacher of the Word of God." Mr. Eastman took as his theme, "Preach the Word."

Rev. Mr. Graham of the Committee on Minutes of the General Assembly submitted a report recommending changes in the Book of Discipline.

The overture of Rev. Mr. Graham to dispense with the services of the two synodical missionaries was referred to the synod, which meets to-day in Los Angeles.

Rev. Mr. Bruce was granted permission to preach without the bounds of the presbytery.

The presbytery decided to hold its next meeting next spring in Chico.

A resolution was offered and adopted thanking Rev. Mr. Baugh for the use of his church, and for the cordial greeting extended, and to the ladies of the church for the attention shown by them to the delegates. Also to the press for full reports of the proceedings.

After a prayer by the Rev. Mr. St. Clair, the presbytery adjourned to the call of the Moderator.

And it is understood that if a greater or less quantity of an article than above mentioned shall be required by the Medical Superintendent, the same shall be furnished by the contractor at the contract price. The contract will be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder, and no bid will be considered unless accompanied by a written guarantee, signed by at least two responsible persons, that the party making the proposal will enter into a contract with the Asylum, on the fulfillment thereof, provided the contract is awarded to said party.

Articles making proposals are specially referred to Section 3235 of the Political Code, approved March 17, 1887.

Section 3235. No supplies of any kind or character for the benefit of the State, or to be paid for by any money appropriated or to be appropriated by the State, manufactured or grown in this State, which are in whole or in part purchased by the State, manufactured or grown in this State, having the control of any public institution under the control of the State or of any county, city and county, city or town thereof.
