Prices in the Sample Wheat Market Show Good Tone.

Outlook in Barley Not Favorable to Sellers—Oats Easy at the Late Reduction.

SAN FRANCISCO, December 6th. Prices in the sample wheat market show good tone, with fair demand on shipping account. In speculative circles values are not as steadily maintained, there being free selling in the Call Board at lower figures. There is no change in barley quotations, as the rain has checked trading, but the outlook is not favorable to sellers. Oats are easy at the late reduction in prices. Potatoes and onions are steady. Dairy produce is unchanged. Mandarin oranges are lower. Lemons are firm. Apples is steady.

San Francisco, Oct. 12, 1894. TO UNITED STATES MARSHALS, SHERIFFS, CONSTABLES, POLICE AND OTHER OFFICERS.

At or about 9:30 on the evening of October 13th the overland mail and express train No. 8 was stopped by robbers, about five miles west of Sacramento, in Yolo County, California. The express car was robbed of about \$30,000 (thirty thousand dollars) in gold coin. The train men and express messenger were shot at several times to accomplish the robbery. The following is a brief description of the robbers, as near as known at present: One about six feet high, weighing about 200 pounds, the other about five feet nine inches, weighing about 170 pounds. Each wore linen dusters and masks and had their faces whitened. The Southern Pacific Company and Wells, Fargo & Company will pay a reward of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) for the arrest and conviction of each of the robbers, and five thousand (\$5,000) dollars for the recovery of the money stolen or a proportionate amount for any sum recovered.
