Moderate Demand for Wheat on Shipping Account—Prices Lower.

Barley Market Tame and Spiritless—Offerings Fairly Liberal, But Trade Dull.

SAN FRANCISCO, December 10th. Wheat prices are still on the down grade. Moderate demand prevails on shipping account, and all demands in that line are readily satisfied.

The barley market is tame and spiritless. Offerings are fairly liberal, but trade is dull. Offer prices are no lower, though the market shows weakness.

The demand for grapes is very slow, with supplies more liberal. Oranges of all kinds are accumulating. Prices are cheap. Berries are scarce and sales slow.

There is little doing in the way of vegetables and supplies are light. Prices are weak in all instances. Potatoes and onions are quiet.

The butter and egg markets are weak, with supplies heavy.

The poultry market is weak, under light demand. Game rules firm. Receipts were light today.
