What values are undisturbed, with the volume of business shows no increase.

The market is inactive, the inquiry being small.

Vegetables and Fruit of all kinds sell actively. Butter is weak. Potatoes and Onions are plentiful. Poultry is weak. Turkeys are cheap. Game is a drug on the market.

At or about 9:30 on the evening of October 11th the overland mail and express train No. 3 was stopped by robbers, about five miles west of Sacramento, in Yolo County, California.

The express car was robbed of about \$50,000 (fifty thousand dollars) in gold coin. The train men and express messenger were shot at several times to accomplish the robbery.
