The New Home for Aged and Infirm Odd Fellows.

President Charles N. Fox Describes the Beautiful Site Selected for the Institution.

Past Grand Master Charles N. Fox, President of the Board of Trustees of the Odd Fellows' Home, who visited El Dorado Lodge, No. 8, on Monday evening, delivered an address at the banquet which followed.

He explained that the order of the Grand Lodge was to establish "a home for aged and indigent Odd Fellows, their wives, widows and orphans."

He then gave a detailed statement of the proceedings of the Board of Trustees in the establishment of the home, and showed that after a full consideration of all the plans offered or suggested they had accepted the plan of Mr. Fox.

The site is situated on the cold bluffs of winter, surrounded by two thousand acres of the orange groves of Thermoito, in a climate never warmer than it frequently becomes in many of the places which had been offered elsewhere, and never so cold as it is at times in each and every one of the others.

There is money enough already subscribed to complete the building and buy an additional fifty acres of land. The trustees also have money on hand to the amount of \$10,000, and are confident that when all the lodges are heard from they will have funds to pay for this additional fifty acres.

About \$20,000 had already been expended on the property prior to its gift to the order. Fifty persons are reported as being in a condition entitling them to admission in the Home.
